



After entry to the residence was made by forcing a door open, items were taken from the residence by Mr. Lane. The items included DVDs. 37" TV. a portable DVD player, two fishing poles and a tackle box. Investigation showed Mr. Lane did have the DVDs, tackle box and fishing poles in his possession. The victim identified the tackle box, fishing poles and movies that belonged to him. Mr. Lane gave a statement to the fact he did commit the burglary and theft.


