crash Chief Aikens observed the occupant of the vehicle exit the passenger side and run through the woods. The occupant was described as a male with light brown skin, black pants and a white bandana. Chief Aikens approached the vehicle and ensured no other occupants were present.

A search of the area was conducted and neighbors in the area were notified of the description of the suspect. At 4:51pm a man saw a male subject walking towards his residence on White Road that matched the description of the suspect. The witness asked the subject to come into the barn and cool off while the man called 911. Deputies arrived and took

suspect into custody and he was identified as Joshua Hayworth. Mr. Hayworth was wearing black pants with no shirt and had a white head cover in his pocket.

The vehicle was reported stolen from Lenoir City during the night time hours.

Hayworth was being booked into the Loudon County Jail for felony theft over \$10,000 and felony evading arrest. At approximately 7pm corrections officers were moving Mr. Hayworth from a holding cell to the bathroom when another corrections officer released the lock on an outside door for someone to enter. Mr. Hayworth then ran out the unlocked door, climbed the perimeter fence and fled the area on foot. Mr. Hayworth was captured approximately two hours later by K-9 Deputy Chris Jenkins and his partner.

In a press release received from Sheriff Tim Guider LCSD was assisted by Knox County SD, THP as well as LCPD and Hayworth was transported to the hospital to be treated for a dog bite he received while being apprehended. While at the medical facility Mr. Hayworth managed to escape a second time through the ceiling area of the hospital while using the restroom. Approximately 30 minutes later he was apprehended in

the ceiling of the hospital and transported to the justice center where he is being held without bond.

Joshua O'Brien Hayworth, 18, of Hwy 72, Loudon, was charged with felony escape, felony theft over \$10,000 and felony evading. Detective Charles Cosner LCSD CID made the arrest.

Sheriff Guider stated, "I have determined that two corrections officers and the two deputies who were guarding Mr. Hayworth at the hospital made errors while performing their duties. The performance of these four officers has always been satisfactory in the past and I trust and have confidence they will continue to do so in the future. However, this incident cannot go unnoticed. Therefore I am suspending the four officers involved for three days without pay."
