

Man charged with trying to set hospital on fire

Police arrested a Lenoir City man after being summoned to Ft. Loudoun Medical Center where he was causing a disturbance. The man is accused of trying to burn the hospital by setting paper towels on fire.

Roger Glen McIntosh, 53, Highway 321, was charged with attempted aggravated arson and was arrested just after 1:00 a.m. by LCPD Officer F. Donth.

Records indicate the officer responded to the hospital in reference to a disturbance and upon arrival met with ER doctors and nurses who ad-(see McIntosh pg. 3)

vised McIntosh was intoxicated and was in a room causing the disturbance and disrupting the peace of the other patients. He had also pulled an I.V. from his arm and was spilling blood in the hallways.

The officer reported when he entered the room he observed Mc-Intosh going through the contents of the hospital's cabinet drawers and when he ordered him to get

back in bed so the medical team could clear him he complied and returned to bed. Moments later, however, as the lawman stood just out of sight of the room, a commotion erupted and upon reentering the room McIntosh was again going through the drawers.

When asked what he was looking for, McIntosh reportedly said his lighter. He was again ordered back to bed and again complied.

After waiting outside the room and observing McIntosh staying is his bed, Officer Donth went to the front ER desk to inquire about the time of the medical clearance. A few moments had passed when a nurse said. "I smell something burning," and the officer went back to Mc-Intosh's room where he smelled something burnt and saw the ashes of burnt paper towels.

McIntosh was taken into custody at that time and a gold Zippo lighter, still warm to the touch, was removed from his right front pocket. McIntosh was then escorted to the patrol car to prevent any more disturbances to the other patients.

Lt. David Flynn, LCPD, secured the hospital room and photographed the evidence. Medical clearance was obtained from the on-duty doc-

tor and McIntosh was transported to jail.


Officer Donth concluded his report by noting he had issued McIntosh a citation for an open container iust a few hours earlier and during that investigation he discovered McIntosh has relation problems and had told his long time girlfriend he was contemplating suicide. With that knowledge, and Mc-Intosh's expressed desire to not go to jail, it was believed it was McIntosh's intention to ignite the hospital building in order to escape arrest or take his own life.

Due to the extremely flammable materials and gasses located inside the hospital and the lives and health of other patients and staff, McIntosh was charged with attempted aggravated arson.

Russell was apprehended at the Garden Center gate and was taken into custody by Sqt. Eddie Range. LCPD.




