Charged

Bowman, 33, Sprinkle Road, Knoxville was charged with felony fleeing, possession of weapon with intent to go armed, driving on revoked license 5th offense and was served a warrant for sell and delivery schedule II (crack Cocaine).

William Douglas 'Lil Bill' Hawkins Jr., 31, Ferry Street, Loudon, was charged with unlawful possession of a weapon by a convicted felon.

According to the report, on Friday, Deputy

Shane Ezell, LCSO observed a purple Cadillac traveling on Martel Road. Knowing the vehicle belonged to Mr. Shawn Bowman, the deputy contacted dispatch and advised them Mr. Bowman was behind him on Martel Road and was traveling towards Knox County and Loudon County had active warrants for him.

Deputy Craig Brewer, LCSO attempted to stop the Cadillac at Martel and Cress Lane, and the vehicle turned onto Cress

Lane as if he was going to stop for Deputy Brewer.

When Deputies Brewer and Ezell approached the vehicle, it sped off toward the end of Cress Lane.

They pursued the Cadillac to a location on Cress Lane where it stopped and one person jumped from the driver's door and fled into a wooded area.

Deputy Brewer followed in his patrol unit and Deputy Ezell made contact with a black male in the driver's seat, behind

the steering wheel of the Cadillac. He was ordered out of the car and taken into custody. He was identified as William Douglas Hawkins Jr.

With assistance from Deputy Michael Watkins, LCSO and his K9 partner Denaro, the second man was taken into custody approximately fifty yards from the vehicle. He was identified as Shawn Derrek Bowman.

In plain view, laying next to the driver's seat was a .45 caliber Llama semi-automatic handgun. After speaking with

Deputy Brewer and reviewing the in car video, it was found Mr. Shawn Bowman was the driver of the Cadillac and Mr. William Hawkins was the passenger and had gotten in the driver's seat after Mr. Bowman fled.

A check through NCIC showed Bowman to have a revoked license.

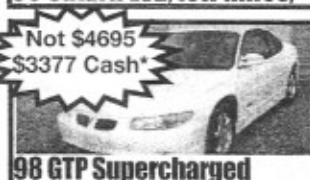
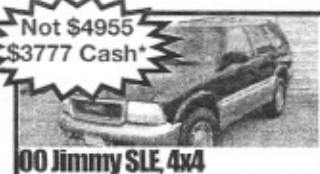
