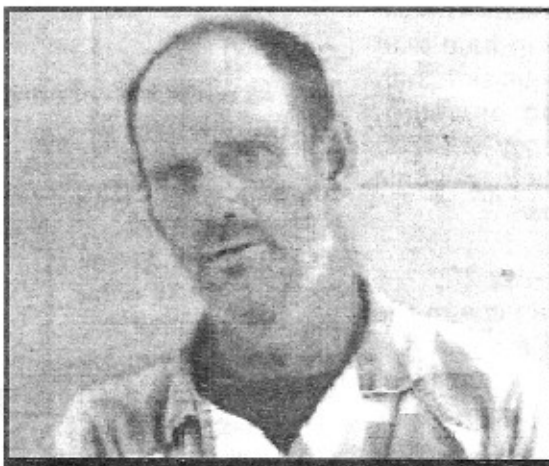
Man jumps over counter to assault clerk at LC tobacco store

A homeless man was jailed after he allegedly beat an on-duty clerk at a local tobacco store, causing her to seek medical attention for injuries sustained in the assault.

Larry Scott Loudermilk, 43, homeless, was charged with aggravated assault Friday.

According to an affidavit filed by Lt. Mike Tinnel, LCPD: Loudermilk jumped across the counter at Discount Smoke and Ale, Highway 321 North, Lenoir City, where he pulled the clerk to the floor then began punching and kicking her in the face and chest.

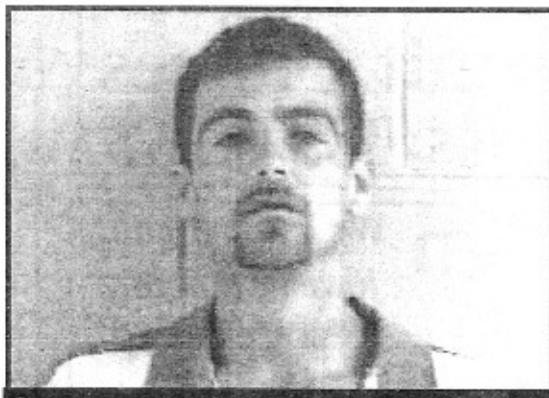
LCPD nabs chain saw wielding man in assault
