## Update: Maryville woman charged with buying alcohol for juveniles

A Maryville woman arrested for domestic violence after scratching her boyfriend and a juvenile has now been charged with buying alcohol for some juveniles who gave her the money for it.

Kristy Renee Shipley, 43, Atchley Apartments, Maryville was charged Tuesday with purchasing alcohol for a child.

The report states, based on witness and juvenile's statements along with a verbal statement made by Ms. Shipley, it was found that on Saturday, November 14th, 2009, Kristy R. Shipley purchased 2 half gallons of vodka for several underage male juveniles, who were located at a residence on Trigon Road in Greenback.

money from two male juveniles to purchase 2 half gallons of vodka for them and after buying the vodka, she took it back to the residence on Trigon

Road where she allowed the young men to consume the vodka. Statements taken from witnesses and other parties involved confirmed Shipley's story.

On Monday, November 16th, 2009, the Loudon Coun-

ty Sheriff's Office, Narcotics Division, served a search warrant at the Trigon Road residence and discovered two 1/2 gallon bottles of vodka, one of which was empty and the other half full, which Shipley confirmed was the vodka she purchased for the juveniles.

Sgt. Billy Hall, assisted by Deputy Shane Ezell, made the arrest.

## Rockslide

time-lapse camera is now available on TDOT's U.S. 64 Rockslide web page (<http://bit.ly/1Tlc8m>).

On Tuesday, November 17, crews with contractor Charles Blalock & Sons, Inc. worked to mobilize equipment to the site while TDOT geotechnical engineers and representatives from Blalock spent the majority of the day ascending and investigating the upper reaches of the rock slope around the perimeter of the slide area. The inspection was conducted to identify critical areas of the rock slope where the contractor will first need to remove loose rock and unstable debris.

Once the debris and rock is removed construction crews will begin trim-blasting operations to bring down the remaining rock overhangs that present an immediate hazard to workers. Tuesday's inspection also allowed the contractors and TDOT personnel to better assess the condition of the slope and identify the areas where the 40' long rock bolts will be drilled and cemented through the slide plane in order to help further stabilize the slope.

On Wednesday crews continued to survey the slide area and worked to clear some vegetation from the slope. Removing the vegetation will improve safety for crews that will begin scaling operations on the slope in the coming days. It will also allow geotechnical engineers to get a better look at the condition of the cracks in the rock and the planes along the slope.

U.S. 64 in Polk County is closed at

mile marker 17.6 due to a major rockslide near the Ocoee Dam Number 2. A portion of Little Frog Mountain slid into the roadway on November 10, 2009. The project to remove the rockslide debris and repair the roadway is expected to take at least eight weeks.

Motorists traveling to the area from Chattanooga or Cleveland should take I-75 North to Exit 60 (SR-68, Sweetwater) and follow SR-68 South through McMinn County and into Ducktown in Polk County. Those traveling from North Carolina are advised to take US-74 to SR-68 North at Ducktown through McMinn County then onto I-75 at Sweetwater in Monroe County.
