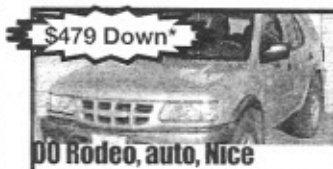

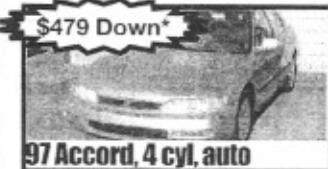

Unemployment Rate

seeing evidence the economy is bottoming out and beginning to show some modest employment growth, which is encouraging news," reported Labor Commissioner James Neeley.

The November rate a year ago was 7.2 percent. The national unemployment rate for November 2009 was 10.0 percent, down from the October rate of 10.2 percent.

Major Changes in Estimated Nonagricultural Employment October 2009 to November 2009

According to the Business Survey, 7,300 job gains occurred in retail trade; 1,800 in professional and business services; and 1,300 in health care and social assistance. Major employment decreases occurred in durable goods manufacturing, down by 1,800; arts, entertainment and recreation declined by 1,300; and mining and construction declined by 1,000 jobs.

Major Changes in Estimated Nonagricultural Employment November 2008 to November 2009

Year-over-year increases occurred in health care and so-

cial assistance, up by 7,500; federal government increased 1,500; and local government educational services gained 1,100. Manufacturing decreased by 29,800 jobs; mining and construction lost 28,200; and trade, transportation and utilities declined by 23,300.

Garlic and Herb Parmesan Knots

Prep Time: 10 minutes

Cook Time: 0 hour, 15 minutes

Ingredients:

- * 1 can refrigerated soft breadstick dough

- * 2 Tbsp. butter, melted

- * 1/2 tsp. garlic powder

- * 1/2 tsp. dried basil leaves

- * 1/2 tsp. dried thyme leaves

- * 3 Tbsp. grated Parmesan cheese

Preparation:

Preheat oven to 350 degrees. Separate dough into 8 rounds and gently unroll. Loosely tie a knot with each breadstick, then tuck ends under to make a knot. In a small bowl, combine butter, garlic powder, and herbs and mix well. Brush this mixture over top of rolls, using all of the mixture.

Sprinkle with Parmesan cheese, and bake at 350 degrees for 12-17 minutes until golden brown. Remove immediately from cookie sheet to wire rack; serve warm. 6 servings
