ways. The Governor's Highway Safety Office will join 88 agencies from 28 counties to kick off the Cumberland Crackdown at noon, Wednesday, December 30.

The Crackdown will be one of the largest enforcement events in Tennessee. Law enforcement agencies will be focusing their efforts on some of the deadliest highways in their jurisdiction (see list below). These highways were identified by the Department of Safety using data from the present all the way back to 1994. Agencies will conduct sobriety checkpoints and saturation points along these roadways from 8:00 a.m., Wednesday, Decem-

ber 30th until 3:00 a.m., Thursday.

"We are able to use a more proactive approach to enforcement this holiday season by using data provided to us by the Department of Safety," stated Governor's Highway Safety Office (GHSO) Liaison Clint Shrum. "Having the ability to determine the areas that are the most dangerous allows agencies to appropriate the right resources to ensure highway safety. Because of this approach the Cumberland Region is experiencing a noticeable decrease in highway fatalities this year."

Director Kendell Poole, GHSO, added, "This time of year can be one of the happiest for families as they get together and

make new memories. However, those happy moments can be stolen away in seconds because the holiday season is one of the deadliest and most dangerous. Enforcement will make a difference."

The Governor's Highway Safety Office reminds all Tennessee drivers to stay safe throughout the holiday season and buckle up, watch your speed and designate a sober driver when taking part in holiday festivities.

Assessment

The new electronic plans review system allows for plans, documents and review fees to be submitted over the Internet. The Tennessee Department of Commerce and Insurance's SFMO enforces fire and building construction safety codes for certain types of buildings. For these occupancies, an architect's or engineer's design drawings are submitted for review and approval by the State before construction begins.

"This new portal means that our plans-review office is essentially open 24 hours a day, seven days a week for document submission and fee payment," says Commerce and Insurance Commissioner and State Fire Marshal Leslie A. Newman, "including payment by e-check. Building plans involve very

large files, and having them in our office as electronic documents will make it much easier to access, store and archive these plans. As documents are reviewed and any needed re-submittals are made, the time and money savings for construction projects will be significant. Upcoming phases of this project will provide additional automation and time accountability regarding a project's status."

The first plans came through Thursday afternoon. Architect Peter Heimbach of the firm Beeson, Lusk and Street Inc. submitted the first set of plans using the new application for renovations to L. Clement Hall at East Tennessee State University in Johnson City. Submitting the plans for the project electronically saved \$200 in document production and transmittal costs for the

project. Heimbach was one of a group of architects who also reviewed the project prototype.

Tennessee is among the first states to implement a process to allow electronic submission of plans and will soon be in the forefront in the nation by offering services allowing owners, architects and engineers access to project information and automated notices designed to streamline the plans approval process.

The SFMO will host a webinar at 1 p.m., January 11, 2010, to assist design professionals in the use of the application. The webinar will be free to design professionals, who will need only a telephone (and access code provided by the department) to attend.

Implementation of the project followed guidelines developed by a study of the department's processes by the state Office of Information Resources. The SFMO partnered with NIC for the planning, design and development of the new online service. NIC develops and manages www.tn.gov, the official website of the State of Tennessee.
