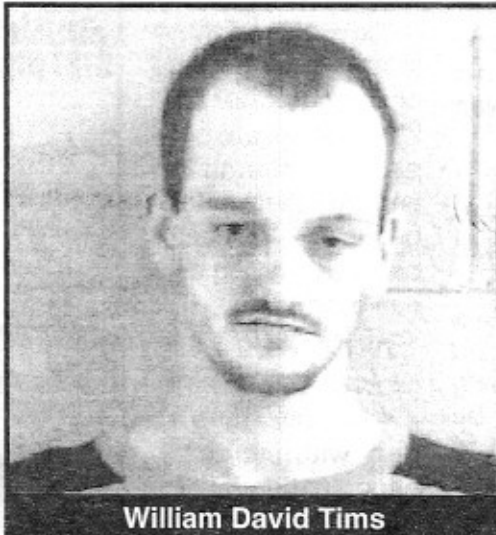

LCSO Narcotics and LCPD team up in bust

Investigator AJ Yokley, LCSO Narcotics Division (ND) conducted an investigation into the purchases of medication that contained pseudo ephedrine by Kelley Ann Adcock and William David Tims for the promotion of methamphetamine manufacturing. During the course of the investigation it was found that Kelley Adcock and William Tims was purchasing different amounts of this type of medication in Knox County and Loudon County.

On Saturday the investigator received a call from the state monitoring system, which keeps track

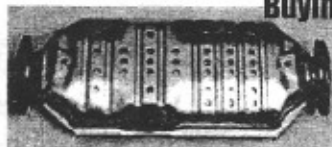

who purchase products used in manufacturing meth, indicating William Tims and Kelley Adcock were in the area buying medication that contained pseudo ephedrine.

Officers from Lenoir City Police Department located Kelley Adcock and William Tims as they arrived at the Walgreen's on Hwy 321 to purchase cold medication.

When Tims exited the store he was taken into custody for warrants for his arrest out of Putnam County.

Kelley Adcock was the passenger of a white Acura Integra. Officers detained her and checked for war-

rants. It was found that Adcock had a warrant for her arrest out of Knox County.

Officers began to search the vehicle that Tims was driving and in which Adcock was the passenger and found several packs of cold medicine; a total amount of 7.44 grams of pseudo ephedrine.

Also found during the search was a gallon jug of distilled water and a bottle of Drano (both used in the manufacturing of methamphetamine) Also found in a trash can outside of Walgreen's was a bag that contained receipts and boxes from 3 other pharmacies that Tims and Adcock had purchased medication that contained pseudo

ephedrine.

A search of Adcock's purse was done and a straw used to inject meth was found.

Kelley Ann Adcock, 23, of Plumb Branch

Lane, Knoxville, was charged with promoting of methamphetamine manufacture and possession of drug paraphernalia.

William David Tims,

25, of Buttermilk Road, Lenoir City, was charged with promotion of methamphetamine manufacture. Investigator Yokley made the arrests.

Arson

Arson is suspected in a Sunday night fire, which destroyed a vacant home and numerous bales of hay.

According to the report, on Sunday at 10:53 p.m. Lt. Investigator Jeff Vittatoe, LCSO was called to respond to a structure fire on Pine Grove Circle in Greenback. The neighbor, Kevin Laforce, stated the abandoned house that was on fire belonged to his mother-in-law, Vicki

The flames were climbing into the hay and the side of the residence. He stated he did not believe the Bordens carried insurance on the old house.

The farm was leased to Felix Daniels for cattle. Mr. Daniels was storing hay in the carport and on the front porch of the old house to keep it dry. There were numerous round bales of hay destroyed by the fire as well.

workplace safety and health. The program is designed to help employers evaluate and prevent the hazardous conditions and work practices that can cause injuries and illnesses.

"As we start this year off we want to create awareness by employers about the consultative services TOSHA offers," said Labor and Workforce Development Commissioner James Neeley. "Last year 543 consultative inspections were made, and we hope by increasing those numbers even more this year we will continue

to see a decrease in workplace fatalities, injuries and illnesses."

TOSHA consultative services are not only free, but they are also confidential. The service is completely separate from TOSHA enforcement operations. No citations are issued for hazards identified by the consultant, and no penalties are proposed. The only time TOSHA enforcement staff would be notified is if an employer fails or refuses to eliminate or control a serious hazard or imminent danger situation within the agreed upon time frame of correcting the issue.
