

Disabled man upset over license Medication calls in bomb threat to LCPD

A Lenoir City man is accused of calling in a bomb threat to the Lenoir City Police Department after he became upset over a drivers license issue, which reportedly occurred several years ago in Knox County.

According to the warrant filed by Detective Jonathan Sartin, LCPD on or about February 6, 2009, Michael Patrick Boatner did call the Lenoir City Police Department on Grand Street in Lenoir City. Boatner left a message he was very irate and said he was going to brink 20 lbs. of C-4 down to the police department and blow it up and he knew where they were located.



The Department of Safety appreciates the privacy concerns of Tennessee's handgun permit holders; however, Tennessee Code 10-7-503 provides that all state records are open to inspection to any Tennessee citizen and the agency in charge of the records cannot deny access to them unless otherwise provided by state law. Currently. there is no state law which prohibits the disclosure of handgun permit records. Therefore, if a newspaper or other person makes a public records act request, the Department provides the following handgun permit information:

Full name, date of birth, address, zip code, county, issue date, and expiration date.

While the Department of Safety Office of Public Affairs complies with state law by providing the handgun information from the hand-gun database upon request, we do not control whether media outlets such as the Commercial Appeal decide to publish the database on their public websites.

In 2007, the Nashville Tennessean published the handgun permit database on its website before shutting the information down within hours of making it

public.

The Tennessee Department of Safety's mission is (www.tennessee.gov/safety) to ensure the safety and general welfare of the public. The department encompasses the Tennessee Highway Patrol, Office of Homeland Security and Driver License Services. General areas of responsibility include law enforcement, safety education, motorist services and terrorism prevention.



The total value of the loss was \$25.


Police Beat


