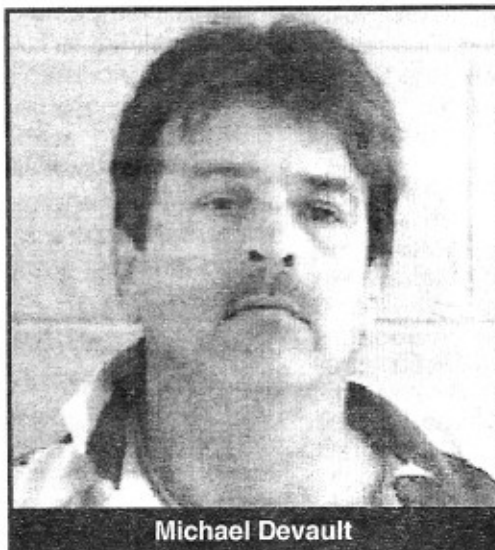

Officer Brendan Deboer, LPD reported he observed a white Honda driving erratically on Highway 11 around the bridge and he observed the vehicle cross over the centerline and then turn into a closed business. The vehicle had an expired tag and was stopped. The driver was Kendra Watson. Ms. Watson had a very nervous demeanor and during a field interview gave the officer verbal consent to a search of her vehicle. The officer identified the passenger as Michael Devault. Mr. Devault also had a very nervous demeanor and appeared to be under the influence of drugs or alcohol.

Edgar J. Zigenfuss 30, Blue Springs Road, Sweetwater was charged with Violation of probation.

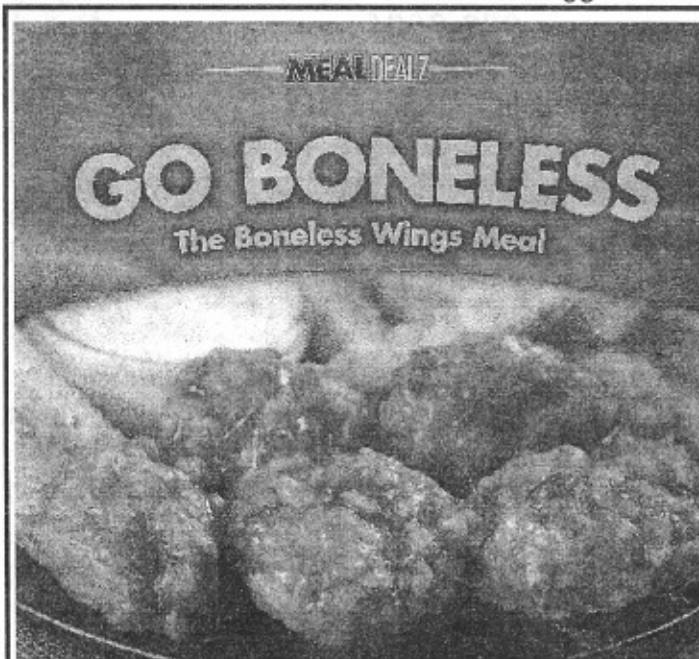
