Registered nurse found with numerous pills after wreck

Troopers arrested a registered nurse over the weekend after her vehicle ran off the roadway and struck several trees along I-40. The caregiver, who reportedly told officers she works for St. Mary's Ambulatory, allegedly kept falling on her head during sobriety tasks and a search incident to arrest produced numerous pills in her possession.

Patricia Ann Patricia Ann Mealer 45, Lakeshore Drive, Kingston was charged with DUI, resisting stop, frisk, and halt and possession of a legend drug without

a prescription Saturday.

According to reports, on Saturday, at 2:15 a.m. Trooper Robert Woody, THP observed Mealer driving a black 2002 Mitsubishi Lancer west on Interstate 40 near the 368 mile marker and saw her run off the roadway and strike several trees.

Upon making contact with the driver, Mealer stated she was uninjured.

The officer reported Mealer's speech was slurred and slowed and when asked for her vehicle registration, Mealer attempted to retrieve it from a pack of cleaners in the vehicle. She also was unable to retrieve her license from her wallet.



When asked to exit the vehicle, Mealer got out and reportedly fell on her head. She was offered medical treatment and refused.

Ms. Mealer allegedly was unable to perform field sobriety tasks because she repeatedly fell on her back and head.
