Driving on two blown tires and .13% on the intox

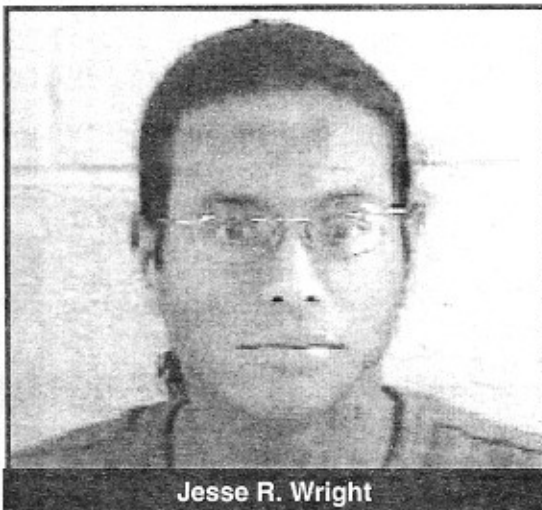
A Loudon man reportedly told police he'd blown out two of his tires in Knoxville just before he was taken to jail for DUI.

ing will be used to provide breast screening services for eligible women in the 10 counties of the Department of Health's Southeast region.

financial support from this local affiliate," said Health Commissioner Susan R. Cooper, MSN, RN. "All of the Komen funds will be used to pay for mammograms provided by our community partners, and we know these screening tests can save lives."

Many counties in the department's Southeast region, which includes Bledsoe, Bradley, Franklin, Grundy, McMinn, Marion, Meigs, Polk, Rhea and Sequatchie Counties, have higher incidence and mortality rates related to breast and cervical cancer than the state average. Based on the most current data available, 2001-2005, Grundy and Rhea Counties have higher incidence rates than the state. Bledsoe, Bradley and Marion Counties have higher mortality rates that the state as a whole. These five counties will be the primary target for the Komen funded project. Hamilton County is also included in this project.

Called The BeST (Breast Screening and Treatment) for Tennessee Women Project, the target group for screening is women between the ages of 50 and 64 who are uninsured or underinsured and have income below 250 percent of the federal poverty level. The project is especially looking for women who have never had a mammogram or have not had one in two or more years.

"Women in this target group are the women at greatest risk for breast cancer," said Susan Merrell, RN, coordinator of TBCCSP services in the Southeast region. "Other risk factors include family

history of breast cancer, increasing age and being a former or current smoker. Many women don't know about or don't take advantage of the annual screening covered by Medicare and other insurance policies. We urge all women to get these annual exams."

"This Komen support will help us provide about 250 mammograms to eligible women in the ten county area," said Dora Coker, RN, TBCCSP coordinator for Hamilton County. "Other funds help us provide both breast and cervical screening services to an additional 1,500 women each year."

firms that Hawk's new standards are for the black redhorse and northern hogsucker. The black redhorse weighed 3 pounds, 1 ounce and was 19 3/4 inches long and the catch time was 10:30 a.m. Four hours later, Hawk caught the northern hogsucker, which weighed 2 pounds, 9 ounces and was 18 1/4 inches in length.

Hawk used 6-pound test line on a 6-foot, 6-inch rod with a shimano reel. The state record entry is the first for the black redhorse. Hawk's northern hogsucker record breaks Dianna Moore's previous record of 1 lb., 3 oz., caught on the Nolichucky River in 2007.

The new marks make three records that Hawk has set in the past year. He set the record for the gizzard shad last April, only to see the record broken in December

by Preston Taylor III, of Bristol, on the Holston in Sullivan County.

The criteria to be considered for a state record fish along with the new record application and instructions, state records and fishing license information are in the 2009 TWRA Tennessee Fishing Guide. Information is also available on the TWRA Web site at by clicking on "Fishing" located on the left side of the home page.

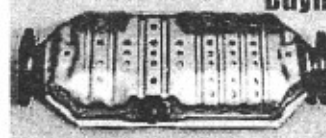

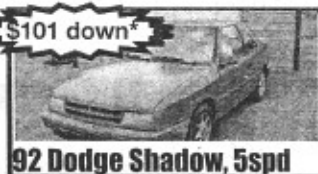

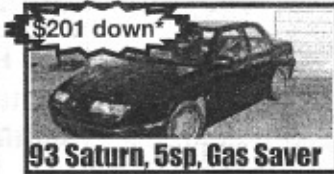
