## 9th DTF and LPD land cocaine bust Theft

Officer Jonathan Yates, LPD met with agents of the 9th Drug Task Force, DTF, to include Agent Steve Cook. Agent Cook informed Officer Yates of a maroon Plymouth Acclaim involved in picking up a half ounce of cocaine from a target location. Officer Yates observed the vehicle pass his location and stopped it. As the officer stopped the vehicle the driver was seen moving around excessively and appeared to be hiding something.

Officer Yates identified the driver as Henry Scott Tilley and Tilley was ex-

Police arrested a Lenoir City woman Thursday after she reportedly attacked her ex-boyfriend and his new girlfriend. She is accused of cutting the couple and vandalizing the man's vehicle.

Dinesha M. Hawkins, 30, Kelly Lane, Lenoir City was charged with aggravated assault domestic violence, aggravated assault and felony vandalism.

According to records filed by Detective Charles Cosner, LCSO, Dinesha Marie Hawkins went to a Highland Avenue residence where she found her

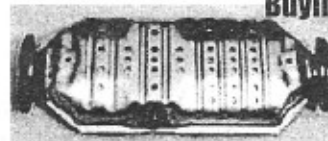

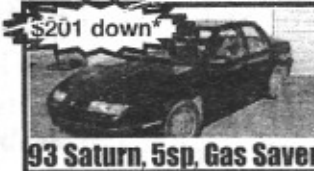

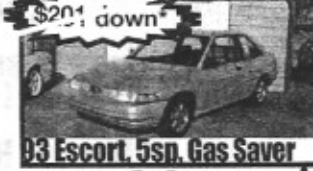

Plus, you have the chance to get planting and care information firsthand from the expert who grew the plants, something you can't receive from most of the larger 'box' stores."
