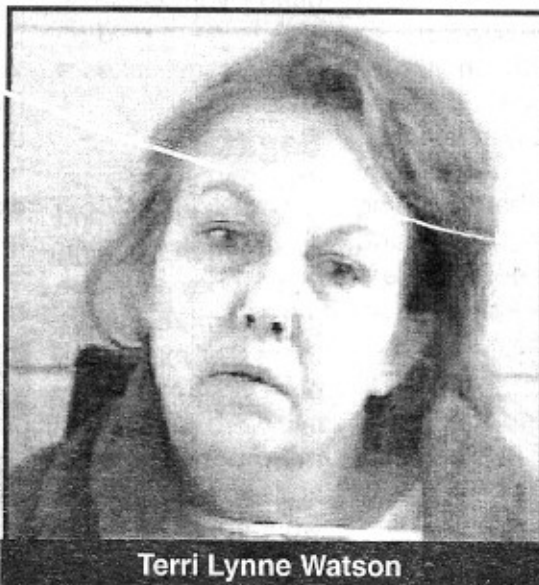
Woman busted for DUI has over 130 pills

The officer turned around and stopped the vehicle on Highway 321 at the Fort Loudon Dam. The driver was identified as Terry Lynne Watson.

Deputy Dixon asked Watson why she was in the wrong lane of travel and she reportedly advised she wanted to kill herself. Ms. Watson reportedly had a strong odor of an alcoholic beverage on her person, bloodshot eyes and slurred speech.

The officer asked Watson if she had any alcoholic beverages to drink or had taken any kind of medications and she stated she drank one beer and took four Percosets and one Klonopin. She performed poorly on field sobriety tasks. Ms. Watson was read implied consent and refused.

After Watson was placed under arrest

the vehicle was inventoried and searched due to search incident to arrest. In Watson's purse were two bottles believed to be Lyrica 50mg, one bottle contained 95 pills and the other bottle contained 34 pills, which is a schedule V narcotic, two white and orange pills believed to be Adderall 25mg, which is a schedule II narcotic, six white pills with 93 834 believed to be Klonopin, a schedule IV narcotic and there were no prescriptions for any of the medications.

Also recovered was a straw containing white residue commonly used to snort pills. Also found in a CD case, a green bottle with a orange pill with MP28 believed to be Amitriptyline HCL 100mg, which is a legend drug, with a different name on the bottle. One empty and one full alcoholic beverage were recovered as well.

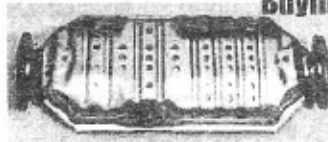

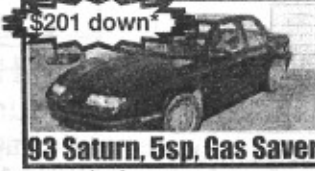
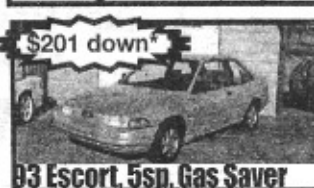
