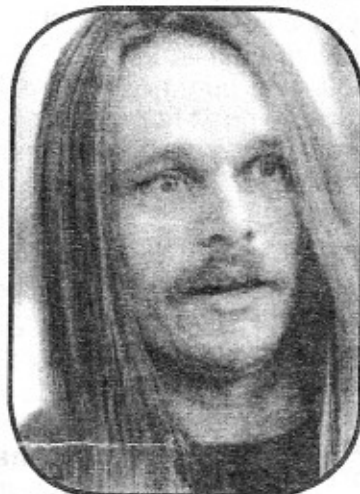

James Edward "Cousin It" Hodges Jr., 34, of Loudon, was killed early Wednesday when a truck driver shot him as he allegedly tried to break into the man's rig.

Reports indicate the shooting occurred around 2:30 a.m. at a warehouse parking lot along Lexington Drive, just off Lovell Road, when Hodges broke out a window on the tractor trailer

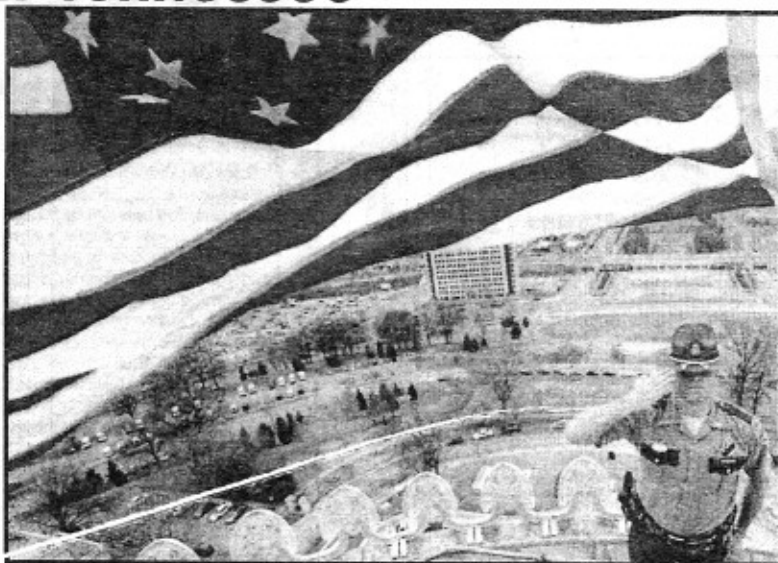

Flag

1518. The flag traveled in the cockpit with the pilot during the flight, and when it touched down at Nashville International Airport just after 1:00 p.m., the plane was met by a water-cannon salute. The Tennessee Highway Patrol's Honor Guard, along with dozens of officers from several agencies including the THP, Tennessee Bureau of Investigation, Tennessee Army National Guard, Sequatchie County Sheriff's Department, Nashville International Airport Department of Public Safety, and Metro Nashville Police, met the pilot at the gate to receive the flag. A motorcade escorted the U.S. Honor Flag to the State Capitol where it flew at half-staff, honoring all fallen heroes and those currently protecting our lives, homes and our country.

1st Lieutenant William Eric Emmert, a TBI Special Agent and former Tennessee State Trooper, was killed in action February 24, 2009, while serving his country in Mosul, Iraq.

Lieutenant David Charles Gann, a member of the Sequatchie County Sheriff's Department, was killed in an automobile crash while on duty on February 17, 2009.

The U.S. Honor Flag originally flew over the Capitol Building of the State of

Texas. Shortly after the September 11, 2001, attacks, the flag was sent to New York City, where it was flown at ground zero during the recovery efforts and at memorial services. Family members requested the flag be used for all other service men and women around the nation, honoring them just as the heroes of 9/11 were honored. Since then, the U.S. Honor Flag has been flown to cities all around the nation, and in October 2004, the flag traveled to Kuwait, Qatar and Iraq.

Hodges was pronounced dead at the scene and the truck driver was transported to Baptist West Hospital for chest pains.

Hodges had a lengthy criminal history including

charges for burglary, unlawful possession of a weapon, driving under the influence, drug charges, aggravated assault, numerous thefts, numerous failures to appear, driving while revoked, criminal trespassing, possession of burglary tools and violation of probation.

Hodges also was wanted in other counties on other charges including theft.
