Unlicensed driver has temper tantrum when stopped for reckless driving

A young, unlicensed Loudon woman reportedly threw a temper tantrum when police stopped her vehicle for reckless driving after she nearly hit another officer's vehicle.

Kendra Nicole Martin, 21, of Ferry St. Loudon, was charged with disorderly conduct. According to the report, Officer Bennie Houser, LPD observed a vehicle pull out from Poplar St and almost hit a vehicle on Cedar St in Loudon. Interest on the offered bonds is exempt from Federal income tax and the Tennessee Hall Income Tax.

The Tennessee State School Bond Authority issues debt to fund facilities such as student housing, athletic facilities and parking facilities at public universities. "This gives us the opportunity to especially reach out to retail investors in the state of Tennessee who realize the value of purchasing Tennessee bonds in addition to supporting higher

education in our state," says Comptroller Wilson.

The "Buy TN Bonds" effort is not limited to this single bond sale, however. Tennesseans are invited to invest in various State of Tennessee bond sales planned through the next several months. Investors may receive notifications of anticipated bond sales by sending an e-mail to Bond.finance.legaldocs@state.tn.us requesting to be added to the Division of Bond Finance's Investor Update Listserv.

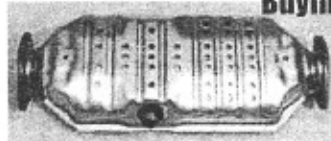

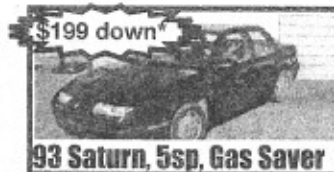

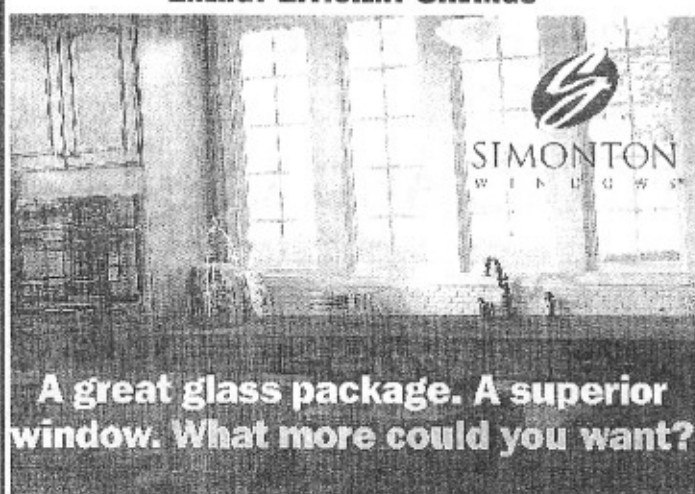
