Two charged with pot for resale after running stop sign, dropping weed

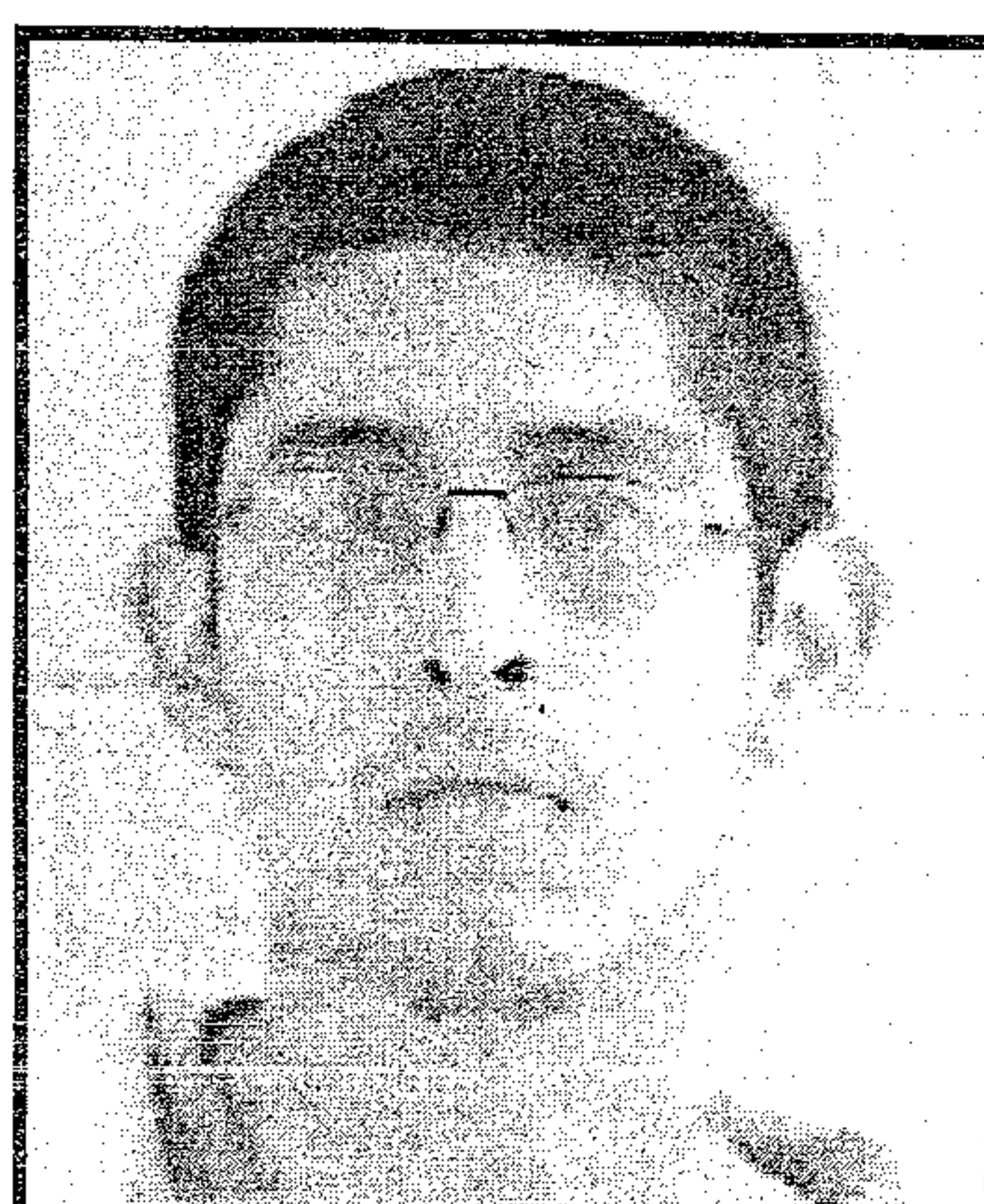
Police arrested two persons for reportedly possessing marijuana for resale after the vehicle they were in was stopped for running a stop sign.

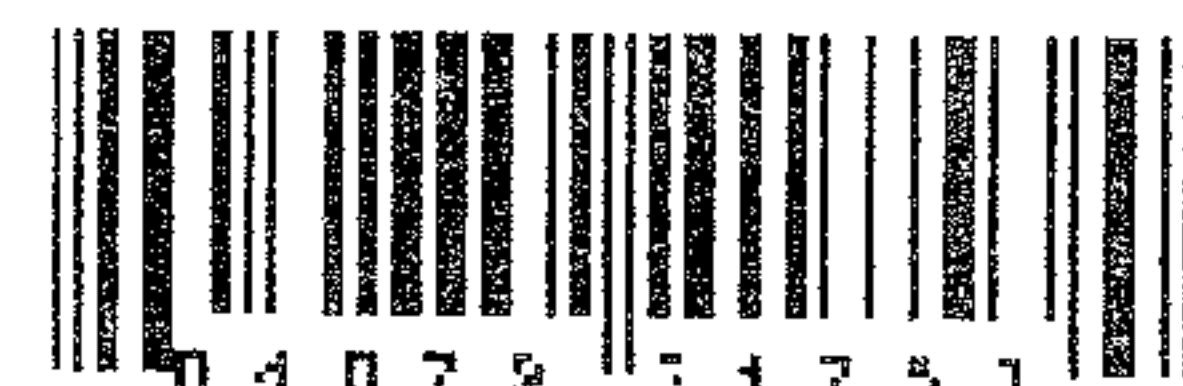

Patrolman Jeremy Dishner, LCPD was investigating a disabled Ford Ranger on the Interstate 75 south exit ramp Saturday when he was advised the Ranger was entered into NCIC as stolen.

The lawman saw the vehicle around the 71 mm northbound. It was following too closely to another car and driving in the cen-

ter lane.

Agent Wilson conducted a traffic stop and made contact with Mr. Miracle.

Miracle had slurred speech, but the officer stated in his report, he couldn't smell any odor of an alcoholic beverage on his person, however he did see several pill bottles in the seat next to Jeffrey Miracle and a half of a pill later identified as klonopin along with other pills identified as oxymorphone.

During the roadside interview Mr. Miracle could not keep his balance and fell asleep, all at one time. Miracle could not do any field sobriety tasks, but he did submit to a BAC and was transported to Fort Loudoun ER for the blood test and then on to the jail where he was given a written warning for the traffic offenses.

Officer Brad Parks, LPD and Agent Jonathan Yates, 9th DTF were also on scene.

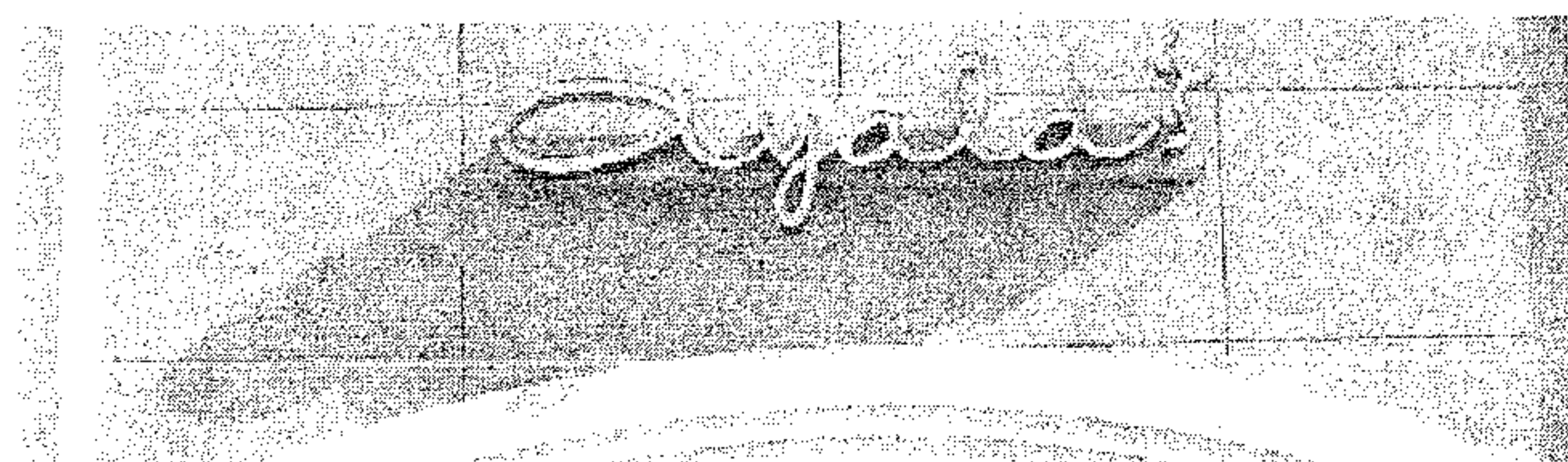

endangerment and violation of implied consent law. The report states, Deputy Kevin Parks, LCSO came in contact with Mrs. Misty Dills, who was at the clerk's office window along with Corrections Officers Corporal Angi Martin, Deputy Daniel Ferguson and Assistant Chief James Davis.

Mrs. Dills came to the clerk's office at the Justice Center on a business matter pertaining to an offense that happened

the night before. The clerk's office notified the jail, advising Mrs. Dills appeared to be under the influence of some type of intoxicant.

Deputy Ferguson made contact with Dills in the parking lot and Deputy Parks came in contact with her at the clerk's window. Mrs. Dills did appear to be under the influence and was placed under arrest for DUI. About that time Deputy Parks was advised Mrs. Dills had her 6 week

old child in the car with her when she arrived at the Justice Center.

DCS was called to come take custody of the baby until Mrs. Dills grandfather could come to take the child.

Mrs. Dills said, "I got behind the wheel about 8:45 this morning." She agreed to take a blood alcohol test at Fort Loudoun ER and as they were leaving the Justice Center she changed her mind and advised the deputy she would not submit to the test.

Once at the jail Deputy Parks asked her to perform a couple of sobriety tasks but Dills refused.


