



"there is the -sob-." At that time, another male subject wearing camouflage clothing and a camouflage face mask stepped around the corner and struck Ms. West in the face with his fist. As Ms. West was falling, Mr. Purdy attempted to catch her and accidently pulled the trigger on the .22 caliber rifle.

After the shot was fired, both of the male subjects fled the location traveling down the driveway. Detective Charlie Cosner was leaving from another call when this call came out and did respond to the scene. After arrival on the scene, an examination of the scene was conducted and a large amount of blood was found where Mr. Purdy said the male subject was standing when the shot was fired

Detective Cosner. Loudon County Sheriff's K-9 Officer Michael Watkins and Loudon Police Department's Jonathan Yates began a search of the area following drops of blood leading from the scene. The trail lead across Steekee Street into a pasture field and then up a small gravel road. leading to 7024 Steekee Road.

Detective Cosner and Officer Yates approached the door of the residence through the open garage and Detective Cosner noiced blood on the door and the area around

the door. Officers could see the male subject through a window, sitting on the couch inside the residence. He was still wearing camouflage clothing and bleeding excessively from the face.

Detective Cosner, Officer Yates and Loudon County Sheriff's Sqt. Jimmy Wiggins approached the door to the residence again to make entry to the residence. The door was locked and Detective Cosner had to make forced entry. Contact was made with the subject, who was identified as Larry Lynn Rasar, age 50.

Mr. Rasar was placed into custody and transported to the University of Tennessee by rural metro. Detective Cosner has charged Mr. Rasar with Aggravated Assault and Aggravated Criminal Trespassing.




