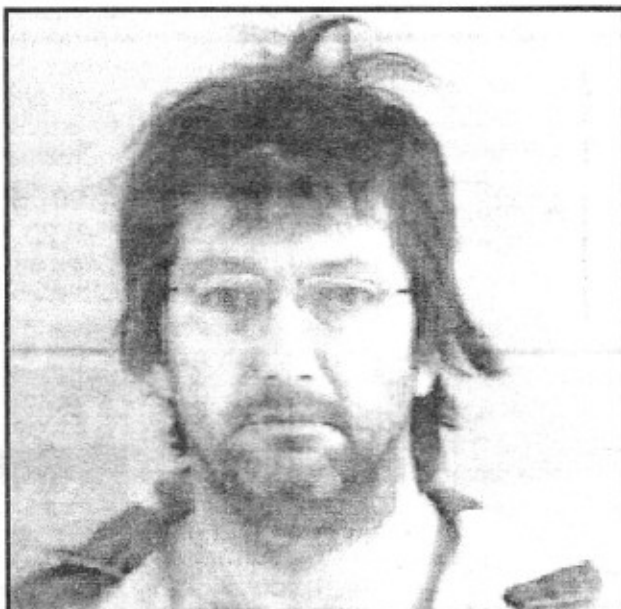
Meth cook supplier busted

A Englewood man reportedly told police he bought products used in the manufacture of math to sell to people who cook meth after items used for the illicit drug were found in his vehicle during a search at a Loudon County residence.

Timothy Richard Queen, 38, Dixon Avenue, Englewood was charged with promotion of methamphetamine manufacture and possession of drug paraphernalia.

According to the report, on Wednesday the Loudon County Sheriff's Office Narcotics Unit along with CID and Patrol executed a search warrant at 200 Cress Lane. Upon searching the vehicles at the residence, officers searched a black 1997 Ford

a female possibly stabbing her boyfriend at a location on Ferry Street. Upon arrival it was determined no one was home at that residence.

The aunt of one of the parties involved advised they had been staying at a residence on Church Street, which was later found to be the location of the assaults.

Upon arrival there, the officers found Ms. Martin in the back yard getting into her vehicle. The male, Gabriel Coronado was found in the house with an alleged stab wound to his left bicep, scratches on the right side of his head and a bite wound to his left thumb.

According to their statements and evidence at the scene, the couple were arguing when Mr. Coronado started to leave for work. Ms. Martin asked for her phone and Mr. Coronado threw it at her, striking her in the chest. She threw the phone back at him and they began to fight.

Ms. Martin stated Mr. Coronado slammed her head into the wall, and she scratched his forehead. At this point it was determined Mr. Coronado was the primary aggressor, until Ms. Martin went into the kitchen and retrieved a 5 inch steak knife and went back to the living room demanding her phone and stabbed him in the left bicep.

Mr. Coronado called the police while she was collecting her things to leave.

Upon returning to the house from putting her things in the car the couple started arguing again and at some point she bit Mr. Coronado's thumb causing a laceration to his left thumb.

The officers determined Ms. Martin to be out of danger when she left the room and Mr. Coronado didn't follow, therefore, she caused a separate incident when she returned with the knife, thereby making her a primary aggressor also. Officer Kent Russell, LPD made the arrest. Gabriel Alexander Coronado, 25, Ferry Street, Loudon was also charged with assault by domestic violence.

Officer Brad Parks, LPD made the arrest.

Queen

Thunderbird that was registered to Timothy Queen.

Found inside that vehicle were two bottles of Roto house-hold drain opener (Lye), a roll of aluminum foil, and batteries. These items are used to manufacture

Methamphetamine.

A check of the Meth Data Base showed Timothy Queen had purchased different amounts of cold medication used to manufacture methamphetamine.

Also found in the vehicle were digital scales, hypodermic needles, a spoon that

had blue and white residue, a piece of aluminum foil and a plastic straw used to smoke methamphetamine, and a small squeeze bottle of water. Also found in the car was a green plastic tub with a white residue that field tested positive for Ephedrine which is a component in the manufacture of meth.

During the interview of Timothy Queen, Queen admitted to buying the lye to sell to other people that cook methamphetamine.

Investigator Adam J. Yokley LCSO made the arrest. Witnessed by Sgt. Billy Hall LCSO and Deputy Shane Ezell LCSO.

is primarily aimed at women, but is an opportunity for anyone 18 or older to learn outdoor skills usually associated with hunting and fishing. However, it is useful for many other outdoor pursuits and interests. Workshop participants will have a chance to take a variety of courses over the three days and the classes are taught by experts in their respective fields.

This year's workshop offers classes in firearms and firearms safety, basic fishing skills, advanced fishing techniques, all-terrain vehicle operation, archery, outdoor cooking, Cajun cooking, introduction to hiking/camping/backpacking, beginning fly fishing, nature photography basics, basic canoeing, basic shotgun, backyard habitat, map

and compass, introduction to muzzleloading, introduction to turkey hunting, introduction to deer hunting, wild edible foray, stream ecology, advanced land navigation (GPS), birdwatching, and basics of safe trailer towing.

The workshop fee is \$175 and includes lodging at the Clyde M York 4-H Center, meals, T-shirt, and a 2009-10 Tennessee Hunting and Fishing License. Underage, under influence

Robert James Hopkins, 19, Keith Avenue, Knoxville was charged with underage consumption of alcohol.

According to reports, Deputy Jerramie Bowen, LCSO was dispatched to a possible underage drinking party on Dixon Road. The complainant stated he found his underage daughter at a party on Dixon Road and she was intoxicated.

When Deputy Bowen arrived on the scene he reported he found several subjects outside the residence and several more ran away. He made contact with Robert Hopkins and he stated he drank about 5 or 6 beers while at the party.

According to witnesses, there were approximately 50-75 people at the residence and all were underage.

Also found behind the house was a small

bag of what was believed to be marijuana.

James Houston Forster, 19, Cross Valley Road, Knoxville was also charged with underage consumption of alcohol.

Forster reportedly told the deputy he had drank about 3 beers.

Caleb Earl McMillian 18, Thornewood Drive, Knoxville was charged with underage consumption.

According to the report, he was found on the back porch of the residence on Dixon Road. He was unsteady on his feet and he had a very strong odor of alcohol about his breath and person. He admitted to drinking 3 beers and is only 18 years old.

James Wesley McCarter, 19, Morton Manor, Knoxville was also at the party and charged with underage consumption of alcohol. He was allegedly standing on the back deck.

McCarter was very unsteady on his feet, had red bloodshot

eyes and a strong odor of alcohol about his breath and person. He stated he drank about 3 beers.

All four were transported to the Loudon County Jail. There were several more citations and petitions issued and to be issued.

Deputy Shane Ezell, LCSO and Deputy Charles Butler, LCSO were also involved in the roundup of underage consumers.
