
Philadelphia man charged after stabbing two people

Police arrested a Philadelphia man after he allegedly went to a neighbor's house and stabbed a couple during a physical altercation.

According to the warrants filed by Detective Charles Cosner, LCSO; on April 1, 2009 at approximately 5:58pm James Roy Christopher went to his neighbor's residence located on Christian Street in Philadelphia and began yelling at a male to come outside of his residence and fight.

According to witnesses, the male victim attempted to get Mr.



Update: Rasar arrested upon release from hospital

Police arrested a Greenback man on assault charges when he was released from the hospital after being shot by the son of a woman he struck in the face.

According to the warrant filed by Detective Charles Cosner, LCSO Criminal Investigation Division (CID), on March 29, 2009 at approximately 1:20am the complainant called the 911 Center and reported two men had come to his residence without the residents permission, one

wearing black and the other dressed in camouflage and did assault his mother when she went outside of the residence to inquire why her dogs were barking.

According to statements made by the victim and witness the male subject wearing black made a statement and when the woman exited the residence a male dressed in all camo stepped around the corner and hit the woman about the face. The witness fired a shot at the subject appearing to strike the suspect in the face.

An examination of the crime scene revealed a large amount of blood at the residence near the door. A series of blood drops and pools of blood were located traveling down the driveway of the residence. Sheriff's deputies followed the blood with the assistance of a Sheriff's K9 ending at a residence located in the woods on Steekee Road, where the suspect could be seen through a window setting on the couch of the residence.

Deputies made entry into the residence and found the suspect bleeding about the mouth area of the face. The suspect did identify himself as Larry Rasar. Mr. Rasar was wearing camouflage clothing and had a face piece

in his possession as well.

Larry Lynn Rasar, 50, of Hwy 95 North, Greenback, was charged with aggravated criminal trespassing and aggravated assault. Deputy Olwin Norman, LCSO made the arrest.

William Eric Brown 37, Taliwa Garden Drive, Lenoir City was charged with driving on revoked, drivers license violation- improper address, and speeding 85 in a 65.

According to records, Trooper Philip Wagner, THP observed a 2006 Chevrolet Impala on I75 north traveling at a high rate of speed. Radar verified 85 mph in a 65 mph zone.

The officer stopped the vehicle at the 73mm and identified the driver as William Brown.

Mr. Brown reportedly informed Trooper Wagner he had a revoked drivers license and it was determined Brown was revoked out of county 33 for DUI on August 19th, 1994. He was also revoked in county 33 on May 6th 2004 for DUI and driving on revoked.

William Eric Brown was placed under arrest, handcuffed, double-locked, and placed in the right rear seat of the patrol car and transported to jail.



Shawn Richard Webster 44, Southside Boulevard, Jacksonville, Florida was charged with DUI by alcohol and/or drugs and possession of a firearm while under the influence.

According to records, Saturday at around 10:02pm Deputy Brad Rayfield LCSO was dispatched to Lakeland Drive on a single car accident that tore down several mailboxes and the vehicle involved, in someone's front yard trying to leave the scene.

Upon arrival Deputy Rayfield found the driver, Shawn Web-

ster reportedly stumbling around the 2008 Kia saying he needed to leave. Mr. Webster had trouble standing on his own and allegedly had a very strong smell of alcohol on his person. Webster had very red, bloodshot eyes, seemed very confused as to where he was and reportedly said he was trying to get to Crossville from Florida. Mr. Webster allegedly stated he drank several drinks earlier. He agreed to try to do field sobriety tasks and could not perform any tasks given.

Mr. Webster was placed under arrest and read the Tennessee implied consent

form and he reportedly agreed to a BAC (blood alcohol concentration) at Fort Loudoun Hospital ER.

An inventory of the

wrecked vehicle revealed a cold twelve pack of beer and a loaded Smith & Wesson semi-automatic handgun that was seized.

A check of Shawn Webster revealed he did not have a permit to carry a gun.

Deputy Brad Rayfield, LCSO made the arrest.





The victim's wife was attempting to separate the two men when Mr. Christopher

produced a large fixed blade knife.

Mr. Christopher did cut the woman's arm causing several lacerations on her right arm and to her right wrist.

Mr. Christopher also assaulted the male victim with the same knife. The male victim also had a puncture wound to the back of his neck and a puncture wound on his left

side just beside the rib cage.

Both victims were transported to Sweetwater Hospital by Rural Metro EMS for their injuries.

Regulation

es Agency (TWRA) has announced.

At its March meeting, the Tennessee Wildlife Resources Commission voted to pass the amendment that reduces the minimum size limit for smallmouth bass from 18 to 15 inches in length. The amendment reduced the smallmouth size limit to 15 inches on Boone and Watauga reservoirs only. Until April 24, the 18 inch minimum size limit will apply on those reservoirs.

The new regulation becomes effective 30 days after it was filed with the Tennessee Secretary of State office.

The 2009-10 Tennessee hunting and fishing licenses are available at any TWRA regional office, licensing agent, and on the TWRA Web site, www.tnwildlife.org.


