

ment of Health prepares continually and has a thorough plan in place to respond to a potential threat to public health in Tennessee," said Governor Phil Bredesen. "We are fortunate to have nationally-known medical experts who are trained to implement a statelevel effort necessary to ensure health and well-being of Tennessee residents."

The Tennessee Department of Health is conducting surveillance to determine if any individuals in Tennessee have this strain of the influenza virus. The Department is also collaborating with U.S. Health and Human Services to ensure the state has adequate medical supplies and necessary medications on hand should they be needed.

As of 11:00 A.M. Wednesday, the Centers for Disease Control and Prevention (CDC) has confirmed 91 human cases of this strain of flu infection in the U.S. and one fatality. The most current information, as well as a state-by-state breakdown, can be found on the CDC Web site at http://www.cdc.gov/ swineflu/.

"It is likely more human cases of swine flu will be detected due to expanded testing and surveillance. As a result, it's important that residents practice good hygiene and proper respiratory etiquette to protect your-

self from the virus and to help prevent spreading illness if you are sick," said State Health Commissioner Susan R. Cooper, MSN, RN. "Simple, commonsense precautions can help protect us, especially those who may be cough

- \* Difficulty breathing or shortness of breath
- \* Pain or pressure in the chest or abdomen
- \* Sudden dizziness
- \* Confusion

ing with warm soapy water, keeping hands away from your face, eyes and mouth, and covering coughs and sneezes with a sleeve or tissue. These precautions can also help prevent the spread of other illnesses including the common cold.

"Our advice for Tennes-

don't spread illness to coworkers or social contacts," said State Medical Epidemiologist Tim F. Jones, MD. "Flu is highly contagious. Staying home can help reduce cases of flu and will help the person recover more quickly."

It's important to note that the illness cannot be contracted from eating foods, particularly pork or pork products.

Today, CDC reports additional confirmed human infections, hospitalizations and the nation's first fatality from this outbreak. The more recent illnesses and the reported death suggest that a pattern of more severe illness associated with this virus may be emerging in the U.S. Most people will not have immunity to this new virus and, as it continues to spread, more cases, more hospitalizations and more deaths are expected in the coming days and weeks.

Tennessee residents who think they may be ill with the flu or flu-like illness should contact their health care provider. Symptoms of the illness are as follows: fever, body aches, runny nose, sore throat, nausea, or vomiting or diarrhea. Your health care provider will determine whether influenza testing or treatment is needed. If you become ill and experience any warning signs, seek emergency medical care. In children, emergency warning signs that need urgent medical attention include:

- \* Fast breathing or trouble breathing
- \* Bluish skin color
- Not drinking enough fluids
- \* Not waking up or not interacting
- \* Being so irritable that the child does not want to be held
- \* Flu-like symptoms improve but then return with fever and worse

\* Severe or persistent vomiting
