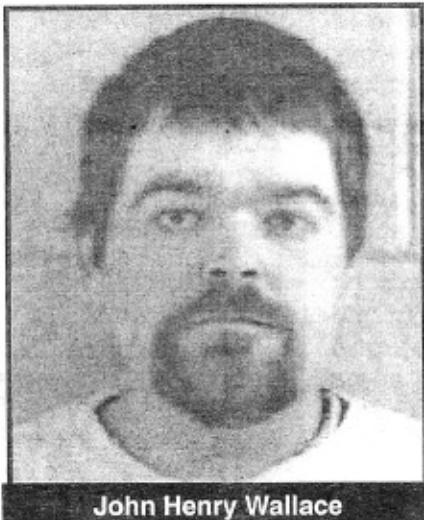

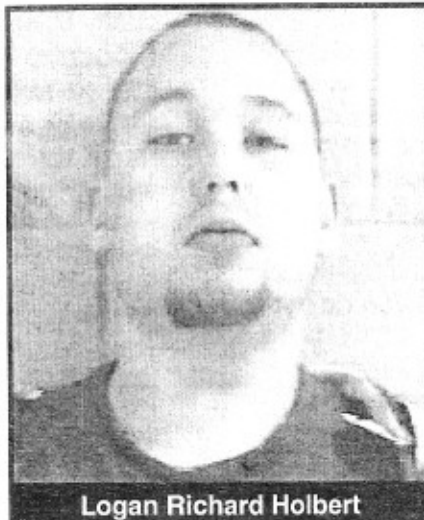

Division of Consumer Affairs Urges Tennesseans to Be Aware of Phishing Scams

Nashville, - "We suspect an unauthorized transaction on your account. To ensure that your account is not compromised, please click the link below and confirm your identity."

Have you received e-mail with a similar message? It's a scam called "phishing" - and it involves Internet fraudsters who send spam or pop-up messages to lure personal information

(credit card numbers, bank account information, Social Security numbers, passwords or other sensitive data) from unsuspecting victims.

According to the Federal

Trade Commission, phishers send an e-mail or pop-up message that claims to be from a business or organization that you might deal with - for example, an Internet

Phishing

service provider (ISP), bank, online payment service or even a government agency. The message might ask you to "update," "validate" or "confirm" your account information. Some phishing e-mails threaten a dire consequence if you don't respond. The messages direct you to a website that looks just like a legitimate organization's site. But it isn't. It's a bogus site whose sole purpose is to trick you into divulging your personal information so the operators can steal your identity and run up bills or commit crimes in your name.

"It's impossible to keep up with the variations of these types of scams because they are forever changing," said Mary Clement, director of the Tennessee Division of Consumer Affairs. "The best way to avoid being victimized is to practice safe computing and report fraudulent e-mails."

Consumer Affairs offers these tips to help you avoid getting hooked by a phishing scam:

Don't reply to e-mail or pop-up messages that ask for personal or financial information, and don't click on links in the message. Don't cut and paste a link from the message into your web browser – phishers can make links look like they go one place when they actually send you to a different site (hovering over the link can help you find out the real address).

If you need to reach an organization you do business with, call the number of your financial institution on the back of your card – not the number listed on an e-mail. And, you always have the option of visiting the business in person.

Use anti-virus and anti-

spyware software, as well as a firewall, and update them regularly.

Don't e-mail personal or financial information.

* Be cautious about opening any attachment or downloading any files from e-mails that you receive, regardless of who sent them.

Forward phishing e-mails to spam@uce.gov – and to the company, bank or organization impersonated in the e-mail.

The Federal Trade Commission has an e-card that you can forward to your friends to warn them about phishing scams. The link is www.ftc.gov/phishing.

Witness

at around 12:00 p.m. she witnessed a silver four door vehicle in Mr. John Goeddel's driveway. The driver was a white male and looked to be in his thirties, with dark hair, wearing a black down vest, with a medium build and about 5'10."

The passenger was a white female who appeared to have long red hair, a thin build, about 5'6," and wearing blue jeans and a down vest.

The witness stated the male got out of

the vehicle and went to the front of the house. He came back to the vehicle and turned it around.

The male and female both exited the vehicle and got into the back seat and put down vests on.

The male went around to the back of the house then came out the front carrying a TV and the female came from the back of the home. They got in the vehicle and left the subdivision.

Several items were taken from the home including a large amount jewelry including some very old antique pieces belonging to Mrs. Goeddel's grandmother, early 1900's jewelry, and. Other things missing included a red billfold, a red pill box, department store credit cards, medical and dental cards, faux Rolodex his & hers white gold watches, a pocket watch, \$30 or more in quarters and a Sony Bravia LCD Digital Color TV-Flat Screen.

The value of the loss was unknown at the time of the report. The case is under investigation.

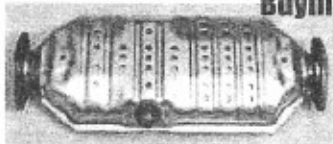

According to records, Friday at approximately 9:00 p.m., John Wallace allegedly struck Benny Worley several times with a large wooden handle.

Mr. Wallace and Mr. Worley were engaged in a verbal altercation over Worley's daughter, who Mr. Wallace is married to. Mr. Wallace reportedly was sitting in a van parked in front of the residence when his father-in-law approached him carrying a baseball bat.

Benny Worley reportedly told John Wallace to get out of

the van while making threatening gestures.

While Mr. Wallace's son was attempting to get the bat away from Worley, Mr. Wallace exited the van and struck Mr. Worley in the head with the wooden handle.

According to witnesses, when Mr. Worley fell to the ground, Mr. Wallace continued striking Mr. Worley with the wooden handle. Mr. Wallace kicked him at least two times while he lay on the ground.

Benny Worley was transported to Sweetwater Hospital for his injuries, which included a large laceration to the head, a broken right leg,

bruised shoulder and a large bruise on his right side about the ribs.

When deputies recovered the wooden handle that was used

in the attack it was broken.

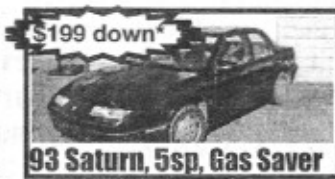
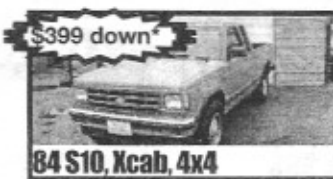
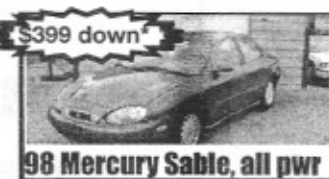

possession of schedule VI marijuana and possession of schedule II for resale crack cocaine.

According to the report, Saturday, Deputy Shane Ezell, LCSO was traveling south on Beals Chapel Road behind a white 1997 Mercury Marquis. He observed the vehicle

for approximately three miles and noticed it was unable to maintain a constant speed. The driver was on and off the brake and crossed the center line of the roadway several times.

The officer stopped the vehicle and identified the driver as Logan Holbert. Holbert appeared very nervous and was visibly

shaking while producing his license.

The status of Mr. Holbert's license was checked and he was asked to exit the vehicle and perform field sobriety tasks.

Sgt. Billy Hall, LCSO ND made contact with the passenger, Ms. Dandrea K. Jones.

Sgt. Hall reported he smelled a strong odor of marijuana when

Ms. Jones opened the door of the vehicle. He and his K9 partner Draga conducted a K9 sniff of the vehicle. K9 Draga gave a positive alert on the vehicle.

When the occupants of the vehicle were advised of the positive alert, Ms. Jones allegedly produced from her pants, a plastic baggie containing approximately 12 to 13 grams of a green leafy substance believed to be marijuana, and a plastic baggie containing approximately 2 to 3 grams of an off white rock substance believed to be cocaine base.

Records indicate Logan Holbert claimed ownership

of both substances and was placed under arrest.

Tools

Deputy Bryan Blakney, LCSO was dispatched to Oakwood Estates Drive in reference to theft. The complainant, Mr. Mike Miller stated sometime the morning someone opened the tool box on his pickup and took three power tools.

The tools were described as two orange gas powered Paslode Impulse nail guns, which cost \$388 apiece, and a power saw.

The value of the loss is estimated at \$900. The investigation is ongoing.
