

the scene of an accident, possession of a handgun while intoxicated and violation of implied consent.

According to the report, at approximately 2:33 a.m. Sgt. Jimmey Wiggins, LCSO observed a white 1997 Dodge truck on Highway 321 near the Blount County line. The vehicle had no working lights on at all.

The officer followed the truck and paced it's speed at approximately 70 m.p.h. The vehicle reportedly crossed the fog line several times. Sqt. Wiggins stopped it on Marble Hill Road at Highway 321.

When the driver, identified as James Spires, exited his vehicle he was swaying and unsteady on his feet and had an odor of an alcoholic beverage about his person.

Mr. Spires reportedly advised the officer he had been drinking and wrecked his truck into a fence somewhere near Greenback, and he was going back the next morning to talk to the owner of the fence. He was given three field sobriety tasks on which he did poorly.

Mr. Spires did have a carry permit for a firearm and reportedly advised there was a pistol in the visor compartment that was loaded.

Upon checking, Sqt. Wiggins found a Kel-Tek .32 caliber pistol in the visor compartment and it was indeed loaded.

Mr. Spires was transported back to the accident scene and then to the Loudon County Jail. He read the implied consent form and also had the officer read it to him. After requesting an intoximeter test, Mr. Spires refused it.

Diaz

charged with driving under the influence and violation of implied consent.

According to reports, Tuesday at approximately 3:18 a.m. while on patrol Officer F. Donth, LCPD observed a gray 1992 Honda sitting on the side of the roadway on Old 95 at Kingston Street.

Rene Diaz reportedly was sitting in the drivers seat passed out. The passenger tire on the vehicle was almost completely detached from hitting a large light pole.

After Officer Donth woke Diaz up and got him out of the vehicle he reportedly stumbled around.

After further guestioning by the officer, Diaz stated he had been drinking.

Due to his accident and him stumbling around it was unsafe to perform roadside tasks.

EMS was called to the scene to check Mr. Diaz and he refused to go to the hospital for further evaluation.

After arriving at the jail Diaz was read the implied consent. Diaz consented and then provided three insufficient samples therefore, he was also charged with refusal to submit a breath sample resulting in the implied consent charge.

deployed to track where Mr. Selvidge had ran. During the truck the K9 crossed the tracks behind the subdivision and on entering back into the woods alerted to a purple bottle with the markings Nexium on the bottle. Inside the bottle was 3 green round pills, 4 orange pills and 1 and 3/4 pills all different mg levels of Oxycontin.

Also in the bottle was a white piece of paper with a clear plastic bag with a white powder believed to be cocaine, weighing approximately 1.5 grams. After tracking to where Mr. Selvidge was taken into custody a search of his vehicle was conducted. During the search a cigarette pack was found between the drivers side seat and the center console. Inside the pack was 2 green pills and 2 orange pills also oxycontin. On speaking with Mr. Selvidge he claimed ownership of the narcotics and admitted to throwing the bottle while running from deputies as well.
