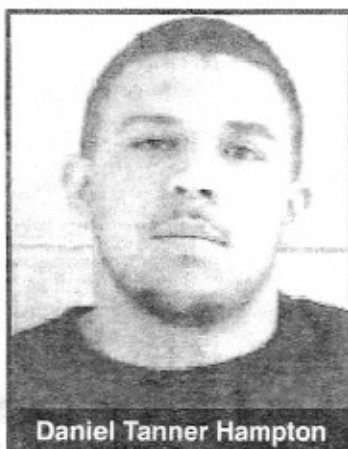
Two charged with coercion in crack cocaine case

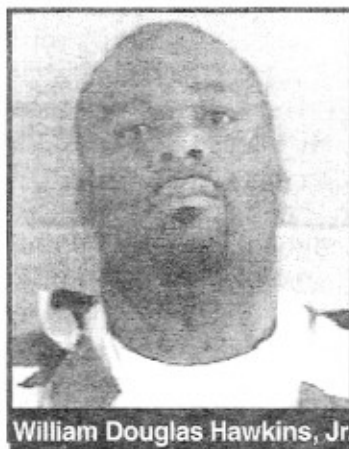

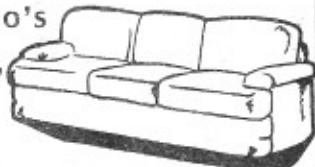

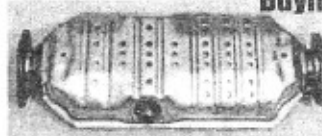
