

#### Charged

City was charged with facilitation of possession of schedule II Cocaine.

According to records. Friday at or around 11:25 p.m., Officer Brendan De-Boer, LPD observed a white Ford pickup driving down Grove Street. While behind the vehicle, thew officer noticed the reaistration was blocked from view.

The officer conducted a traffic stop for improper display of registration. The driver was identified as Quinn Coffey. Officer DeBoer also identified two other passengers as April Denton and William Hawkins Jr., whom are allegedly

known to be involved in narcotics related activities.

Mr. Coffee was extremely nervous during the field interview and gave consent to search his vehicle.

There were four pills believed to be Tramadol, a legend drug. reportedly found in the pickup that belonged to Ms. Denton, that were not prescribed to her. April Denton was placed in custody for possession of legend drugs.

While being placed into custody Denton allegedly made a verbal statement she had cocaine on her person and it belonged to Mr. Coffey.

Ms.Denton was transported to the Loudon County Jail where a search reportedly produced 5.8 grams of a substance that field tested positive for the presence of cocaine. The substance was in two individual bags.

Mr. Coffey was advised of his rights and gave statements verifying his involvement in using his vehicle and driving to a location in Knoxville to knowingly purchase narcotics.

#### Dillon


