
Three charged after meth complaint


Three persons were jailed after police received a complaint of possible meth activity. Two of the persons were charged in connection with manufacturing meth while the third was taken into custody on a warrant.



Officer Bowman stopped the vehicle in the CVS parking lot for a seat belt violation.

When the driver, Edward Keyt, was asked to exit the vehicle, the officer noticed Mr. Kevt throw two small baggies containing a white powder substance believed to be methamphetamine, which weighed approximately 2 grams.

After Keyt was placed into custody, an inventory search was performed on the vehicle. One can


