Three persons were jailed after police received a complaint of possible meth activity. Two of the persons were charged in connection with manufacturing meth while the third was taken into custody on a warrant.

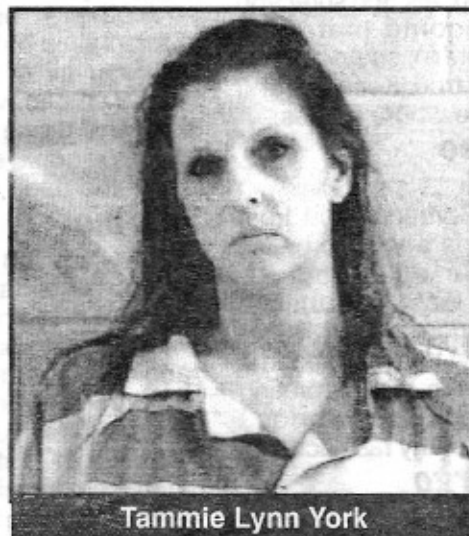

ence to suspicious activity involving a red 2001 Mazda. While en-route to Walmart he spotted the Mazda traveling south on Highway 321 near the Taco Bell.

Officer Bowman stopped the vehicle in the CVS parking lot for a seat belt violation.

When the driver, Edward Keyt, was asked to exit the vehicle, the officer noticed Mr. Keyt throw two small baggies containing a white powder substance believed to be methamphetamine, which weighed approximately 2 grams.

After Keyt was placed into custody, an inventory search was performed on the vehicle. One can

of Coleman fuel, one box of sudafed and numerous lithium batteries were discovered in the Mazda.

All of the items are precursors to manufacture methamphetamine. Patrolman James Bowman, LCPD, made the arrest, along with Officer Jason Butler, LCPD Narcotics.

Tammie Lynn York, 40, Monroe Street, Sweetwater, was charged with promotion of methamphetamine manufacture.

According to reports, Ms. York was a front seat passenger in the red Mazda and she was in possession of one can of Coleman fuel, which was in plain view.

The report further stated, upon investigation officers found York obtained the Coleman fuel along with sudafed for Edward Keyt to use in the process of manufacturing methamphetamine.

The officers also reportedly found a receipt from Walmart in York's pocket showing that York purchased the precursors near the time of the initial complaint.

Michail L. Lancaster, 55, Vonore Road, Sweetwater, was taken into custody on a warrant out of Monroe County, for violation of probation.

According to records, Mr. Lancaster was also a passenger in the red Mazda.

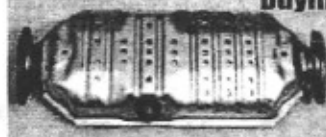
