Gordon

Detective Jonathan Sartin charged a Nashville man with criminal responsibility and assault after he reportedly went to a Lenoir City business with a friend who forged a check, then returned the next day to write one of his own. He is further accused of assaulting the manager upon being stopped.

Ronnie Gordon, 52, Panorama Drive, Nashville, was charged with aggravated assault and criminal responsibility: facilitation of felony.

According to warrants filed by Detec-

tive Jonathan Sartin, LCPD; on or about May 14th, 2009, Ronnie Gordon went to the Tractor Supply, on Highway 321 in Lenoir City with another person who passed a counterfeit check. The check had Griffiths Plumbing Contractors, LLC on it and the account belonged to someone else.

Mr. Gordon reportedly went with the other person knowing what the other person was going to do.

In another warrant, Detective Sartin noted Gordon again went to Tractor Supply where he started to write a check on the same

account. The manager stopped Gordon and tried to get him to stay until the police arrived because of the forgery and theft from the day before.

Ronnie Gordon then shoved the manager backwards and went towards his truck with the manager following. Gordon got into his truck and pulled a box cutter out and tried to cut the manager with it.

Deputy Rob Lane, LCSO, arrested Gordon at Cumberland County Jail on the aggravated assault warrant and transported him back to the Loudon County Jail where Deputy

John Wilson served him the criminal responsibility warrant.

Robert Clifford Henning IV, 23, Old Citico Road, Vonore, was charged with public intoxication.

According to records, Saturday at around 5:50 a.m., while on routine patrol on Highway 411 at East Coast Tellico Parkway Deputy Charles Butler, LCSO observed a white male standing beside a green Ford Ranger pickup on the shoulder of the roadway. The officer activated his blue lights and called in the Tennessee tag.

The man was identified as Robert Clifford Henning IV. Mr. Henning advised he ran out of gas and had been walking to find a gas station. He had a very strong odor of alcohol about his breath and person, was very unsteady on his feet, had red glassy eyes and slurred speech.

Officer Butler noted he felt Henning to be a danger to himself and others and placed him under arrest for public intoxication.

Reports indicate on Saturday night Deputy Michael Watkins, LCSO and TVA Officer Tom Atchley responded to Coyatee Road at the campground area for a drunken subject discharging a firearm.

Virginia officials told Loudon police they would extradite a man who was checked on by local officers after he was found standing on the onramp late Monday and discovered wanted for violation his probation.

Timothy Ray Farrell 55, Homeless, was charged with being a fugitive from justice.
