



According to records, early Friday morning at approximately 12:42 a.m., Officer F. Donth, LCPD responded to Highway 11 and Highway 321 in reference to a silver 1991 Toyota van sitting at the intersection with a white male asleep in the driver's seat.

Upon arrival the officer observed a man sitting in the driver's seat passed out at the wheel. He was later identified as Stephen Douglas Flynn. Flynn reportedly had an open, half-drunk bottle of beer between his legs.

Officer Donth woke Flynn and asked him to step out of the van and when he did a small round metal pipe fell from his lap. It reportedly had burn residue on one end and when asked what it was used for, Mr. Flynn stated it's used for smoking crack.

Flynn was given roadside sobriety tasks and completed them successfully.

The officer asked if there were any drugs in the vehicle and Flynn replied, "No, not at all, go ahead and search it." After waking up a passed out passenger and having her step out, Officer Donth located another pipe used for smoking cocaine. A piece of crack cocaine was also found in the vehicle.

A field test later showed it to be positive for cocaine.

Mr. Flynn allegedly stated he uses cocaine and smoked some recently. Stephen Flynn was placed into custody and his passenger called her uncle for a ride home.

Approximately 20 to 25 minutes prior to being dispatched to the wreck, a clerk


at a Highway 72 location had advised Officer Houser of a man with tattoo sleeves on both arms driving a white older model Ford pick-up






