surrounding, one pair 10K gold earrings with a diamond in each one, college class ring with two black onyx stones, gold ring with a quartz vein through it, 14K gold charm bracelet with heart and tennis racket charms on it, 14K gold Omega bracelet, gold necklace with a 1/4 carat Princess cut diamond charm and a gold necklace with Opal charm.

The total value of the loss was estimated at \$8870.

Oody

Officer Jonathan Yates, LPD observed Mr. Oody driving a gray 1994 Chevrolet Beretta on Highland Avenue and had prior knowledge his license was revoked.

The officer stopped the vehicle on Carding Machine Road.

Mr. Oody reportedly exited the vehicle quickly and walked back to Officer Yates. Dispatch confirmed his license status to be revoked for failure to file after an accident.

Mr. Oody reportedly gave his consent to search. A white bottle was discovered with no label approximately ten feet from the car. The bottle was reportedly used to store a variety of scheduled narcotics.

Found in the bottle were several pills including two peach colored Methadone wafers - schedule II, six yellow oblong Endocets - schedule II, one and a quarter green 80mg Oxycontin - schedule II and two blue Xanax, schedule - IV.

Mr. Oody disclaimed ownership and knowledge of the narcotics.

No License

Alvaro Mondragon Valentin, 24, Galaher View Road, Knoxville was charged with driving without a license, driving under the influence, violation of implied consent and open container violation.

According to records, Sgt. Lynette Ladd, LCPD observed a white 2002 Ford truck traveling on Old Highway 95. The driver was tailgating another vehicle and appeared to be attempting to pass on a double yellow.

and extremely red eyes. An open container of beer was found near the drivers seat, under a jacket, it was cold and partially full.

A check through NCIC determined Valentin did not have a valid drivers license. The area was not appropriate for field sobriety tasks to be given and there was a communication barrier.

Once at the jail, Mr. Valentin had difficulty exiting the vehicle. An interpreter read him the implied consent form and he allegedly agreed to submit

using the intoxometer.

Valentin refused to give a sufficient sample, reportedly holding his breath instead of exhaling into the intoxometer.

Bryan Casaca, 23, of Johnson Drive, Lenoir city was charged with driving without a license.

According to the report, Officer Jason Felts, LCPD stopped a green vehicle for a broken turn signal and found Casaca to have no license.

Marvin Antonio Olmedo Rosales, 24, D Street, Lenoir City was charged with driving without a license.
