During the search of the residence officers discovered approximately 1 1/4 pounds of a green leafy substance believed to be marijuana, much of the substance was bagged in individual baggies ranging in weights from 15 grams to one ounce, that were located in Owrutzky's bedroom. Also in the bedroom were scales, baggies and other paraphernalia used to package marijuana for resale.

Located in a barn at the residence in a concealed underground room, were 17 marijuana plants growing under two large grow lights and a CO2 gas system. The lights and gas system were both set on timers. Also found in the barn were two papers bags containing clippings and five other plants that had been discarded. During an interview Mr. Owrutzky admitted to selling and growing marijuana.

Davila

was charged with DUI 3rd offense and driving on revoked license.

According to reports, Thursday at approximately 11:23 p.m., Lt. David Flynn, LCPD received a reckless driver call on Grand Street. Upon arrival at the scene the officer observed a white GMC Sonoma traveling north on Grand Street.

adjusted unemployment rate for April 2009 was released last week at 9.9 percent, 0.3 percentage point higher than the revised March rate of 9.6 percent. The United States' unemployment rate for the month of April was 8.9 percent.

County non-seasonally adjusted unemployment rates for April 2009, show that the rate increased in 29 counties, decreased in 59 counties and remained the same in seven counties.

Lincoln and Williamson County registered the state's lowest county unemploy-

ment rate at 6.3 percent. Perry County had the state's highest unemployment rate at 23.9 percent. down from 25.6 in March, followed by Scott County at 18.3 percent, down from 18.8 percent in March.

Knox County had the state's lowest major metropolitan rate of 7.4 percent, up 0.1 percentage point from the March rate. Davidson County was 8.0 percent, up 0.1 from the previous month. Hamilton County was at 8.3 percent, up 0.3 percentage point from the March rate, and Shelby County was 8.9 percent, unchanged from the March rate.
