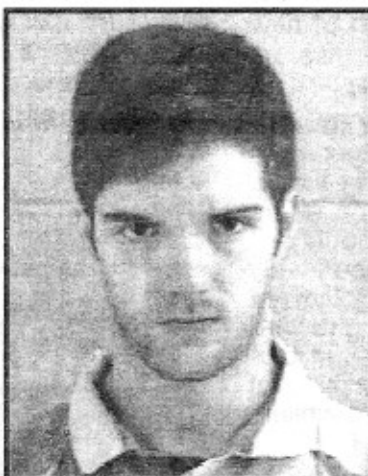

Eugenio Martinez Tores, 28, Burroughs Road, Alcoa was charged with fishing without a license.

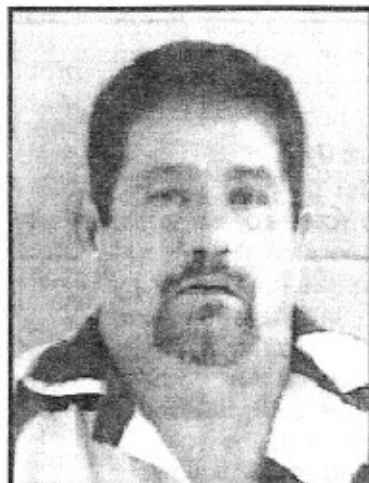

## Property

## Cox

Friday at approximately 5:45 a.m., Investigator AJ Yokely, LCSO received a phone call from Deputy Jerramie Bowen while he was out serving an arrest warrant for failure to appear on Shaun Craig Cox at Cox's residence on Crooked Oak Drive.

Deputy Bowen told the investigator he saw drug paraphernalia and a small amount of a green leafy substance he believed to be marijuana in the bedroom.

When Investigator Yokely arrived he advised Shaun Cox of his rights and asked him if there was any marijuana in the house.

Cox allegedly stated he had approximately 21 grams in a Fox Sunglass box on the table in his bedroom.

Mr. Cox reportedly gave consent to

search his bedroom. Inside his bedroom, approximately 19 grams of marijuana was located in a Fox Sunglass box and a small amount of marijuana was found in a cigarette box next to Cox's bed.

A drug ledger, digital scales, hemostats, small plastic bags, marijuana grinder and several other drug paraphernalia items reportedly also were discovered in Cox's bedroom.

Investigator AJ Yokely, assisted by Deputy Bowen, and Sgt. J.J. Wiggins, LCSO made the arrest.

## Mower

According to reports, Mr. Charles Buddy Jenkins, Happy Hollow Road, told Deputy Mickey Patterson, LCSO he and his family were in the process of moving and left the residence on Thursday evening at 8:00 p.m.

Jenkins said when they returned six days later on Wednesday they discovered someone broke the lock off the storage barn door and took their black, 18 " cut Murray riding mower.

The value of the loss was estimated at \$1200.

moving car near the Monroe County line.

The driver, John Palladin Gibson produced a Tennessee ID only. A check through NCIC revealed his license are revoked for DUI, showing he had a prior DUI in October of 2004.

Mr. Gibson allegedly had slurred speech and a strong odor of an alcoholic beverage about his person. He stated he consumed two beers.

The officer asked Gibson to exit the vehicle and when he did he was very unsteady on his feet. Gibson performed poorly on field sobriety tasks and was arrested.

Mr. Gibson also received a citation for speeding and open container due to a half empty 32oz. beer found cold in the floorboard of his vehicle.

Ryan Edgar Schacher, was charged with driving on suspended license.


