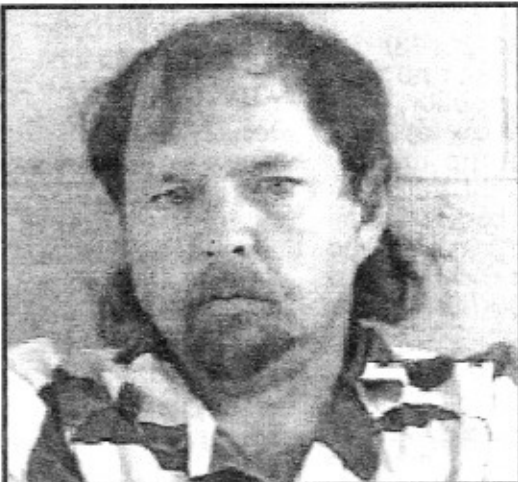

Two charged in drug bust

A Loudon man and his roommate were taken into custody Saturday when members of the Loudon Police Department, agents from the ninth Judicial DTF and other officers served a executed a search warrant at their home and reportedly found crack cocaine and other drugs on the premises.

Jeffrey Douglas McMillan, 44, Vale Street, Loudon, was charged with possession of schedule II (crack cocaine), simple possession of schedule VI (marijuana), possession of a legend drug (Seroquel), possession of schedule II (methadone), possession of schedule III (Tylenol with codeine) and possession of drug paraphernalia.

According to the report, on Saturday at around 12:18 a.m., Officer Brendan DeBoer, LPD along with agents from the 9th Drug Task Force and LCPD conducted a search warrant at 908 1/2 vale Street in Loudon. The residence belongs to Jeffrey McMillan and he was at home at the time the execution of the warrant was made.

Allegedly found in-

side the residence was approximately four grams of a substance believed to be crack cocaine, a schedule II narcotic and a small amount of a substance believed to be marijuana. Also located in the home was a metal container reportedly containing several Seroquel pills, a legend drug, 1/2 of a methadone pill, a schedule II drug and one Tylenol with codeine pill, a schedule III drug.

A glass pipe commonly used for smoking crack cocaine was also allegedly discovered in the residence.

According to another report, Galyon was charged when officers executed the search warrant at the home and a pill believed to be hydrocodone was discovered in a bedroom occupied and belonging to Jeremy Galyon.

Besides the possession charge, Galyon was also charged on an outstanding warrant for violation of probation.

Officer Brendan DeBoer, along with Officers R.S. Newman and April Farmer, LPD made the arrest.

If consumer fireworks are legal where you live and you decide to set them off on your own, be sure to follow these important safety tips:

- * Never allow children to handle or ignite fireworks.

- * Read and follow all warnings and instructions.

- * Be sure other people are out of range before lighting fireworks.

- * Only light fireworks on a smooth, flat surface away from homes, dry leaves, and flammable materials.

- * Never try to relight fireworks that have not fully functioned.

- * Keep a bucket of water and a garden hose nearby in case of a malfunction or fire.

- * Like matches and lighters, sparklers are not toys and cause hundreds of injuries every year. Sparklers burn hot, can reach temper-

atures as high as 1,200° F, and stay hot long after they've burned out. You wouldn't hand a matchbook or lighter to a child to wave around or play with – so, don't give a child a sparkler.

Fireworks can be dangerous, causing serious burn and eye injuries. A 2007 law prevents children under 16 from purchasing fireworks; and those who are age 16 or 17 must present a photo ID to purchase them.

Clean Hands Can Help Prevent Infection

(NAPSI)—Concerns about the recent outbreaks of a new influenza virus-H1N1 Flu (Swine Flu)-have raised questions about effective ways to reduce the risk of flu infection.

According to the Centers for Disease Control and Prevention (CDC), there are simple precautions-such as

washing hands-that can help reduce that risk.

CDC has reported that the spread of H1N1 influenza A (swine) virus is thought to be happening in the same way that seasonal flu spreads.

Flu viruses are spread mainly from person to person through coughing or sneezing of people with influenza. Sometimes people may become infected by touching something with flu viruses on it and then touching their mouth or nose.

There are several simple precautions CDC recommends everyone practice in order to stay healthy:

- * Cover your nose and mouth with a tissue when you cough or sneeze. Throw the tissue in the trash after you use it.

- * Avoid touching your eyes, nose or mouth. Germs spread that way.

- * Stay home from

work or school if you get sick and limit contact with others to keep from infecting them.

- * Wash your hands often with soap and water, especially after you cough or sneeze. Alcohol-based hand cleansers are also effective.

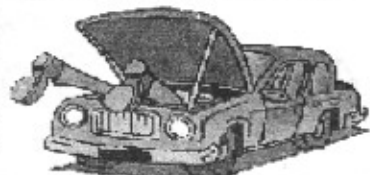

Operation

TWRA boating officers will saturate in high traffic areas on reservoirs across the state. Along with the use of life jackets and other safety practices, officers want boaters to be aware of the effects and ramifications of alcohol use.

As part of "Operation Dry Water," the TWRA will be intensifying efforts to detect and apprehend boat operators who are operating under the influence of alcohol or dangerous drugs. Operating a boat with a Blood Alcohol Content of .08 percent or higher is illegal in Tennessee, the same as operating a motor vehicle. Penalties may include fines, jail, boat impoundment and the loss of on-the-road

driving privileges.

Statistics show that more than 20 percent of boating-related fatalities are a result of alcohol use. Sun, wind, noise, vibration and motion intensify the effects of alcohol, drugs and some medications.

Unwanted drunk

Eric David Hellem, 25, Raby Road, Sweetwater was charged with public intoxication and criminal trespassing.

According to records, Sunday at around 6:50 p.m., Deputy Chris Jenkins, LCSO responded to a Dry Valley Road residence on an unwanted person inside the home. The homeowner advised earlier in the evening the complainant and Eric Hellem were in a physical altercation in Monroe County.

Later, Mr. Hellem

came to the residence on Dry Valley Road and went inside, reportedly unclothed, knowing he did not have the homeowners effective consent to do so.

Upon making con-

tact with the man and identifying him as Eric David Hellem, the officer stated in his report he was on the couch being restrained due to being intoxicated and being an unreasonable annoy-

ance to the people in the residence.

Hellem was reportedly unsteady on his feet, had red watery glassy eyes and a heavy odor of an alcoholic beverage on his person.

City, she looked into her vehicle to get her prescriptions and noticed her scripts, gift cards and her mother's debit card were missing from the glove box.

Davis stated she had left the windows on her vehicle down while she went to her mother's house.

It is also helpful to minimize the amount of extra pillows and stuffed animals that are kept on the bed, since they are prone to collecting dust mites.

- Don't hang laundry outside, where it may collect pollen and other allergens. Use the clothes dryer or hang the clothes inside.

- Use a portable room air cleaner in your child's bedroom to filter airborne particles and help him

or her breathe-and sleep-easier. A portable air cleaner that's received a Clean Air Delivery Rate seal reduces the level of airborne pollutants.

Before getting the air cleaner, determine the size of your child's bedroom. You can search for air cleaners in a directory found on www.cadr.org and compare certified models. Look at the ratings for tobacco smoke, dust and pollen and find the models with the highest ratings, since they'll clean the room the fastest. You can then weigh the importance of product features, such as noise levels and design, to find an air cleaner that fits your needs.

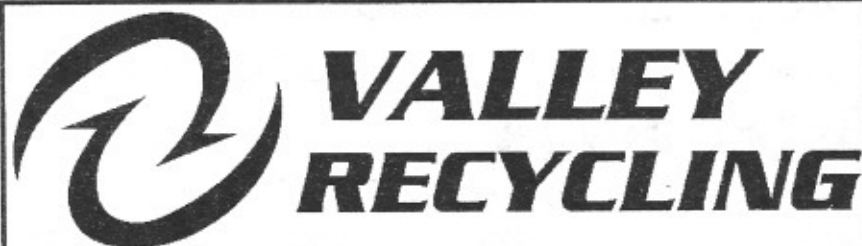

approximately 7:28 p.m., Officer Blake Norman, LPD observed a black Jeep Cherokee traveling east on Highway 72 at a high rate of speed, 52 m.p.h. in a 45 m.p.h. zone. The officer stopped the vehicle and identified the driver as Mr. John D. James.
