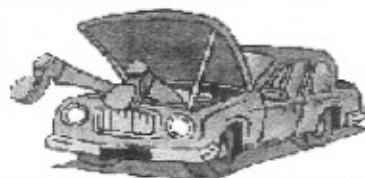

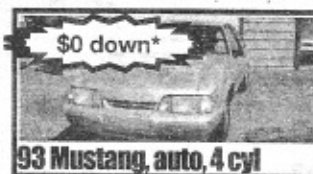

According to the report, Deputy Daniel Ferguson, LCSO went to the visitation area of

the jail to tell another family member the inmate they came to see had already had a visit when he noticed Kortney Paulins was sitting in a booth having a visit with an inmate who is charged with domestic violence where she was the victim. The inmate is currently under bail grant orders to have no contact with

the victim.

Paulins began to raise the tone of her voice and curse at Deputy Ferguson. At that time

When advised she was under arrest for disorderly conduct Paulins ran out the door and at the bottom to the steps the deputy began to handcuff Paulins and she began pulling away and cursing at the deputy.
