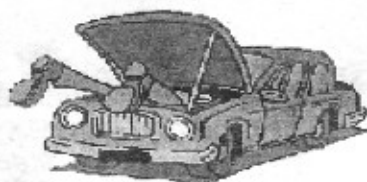

a.m., Patrolwoman April Farmer, LPD observed a maroon vehicle fail to stop at the stop sign on Summer Street while turning onto Keene Street. She stopped the vehicle and identified the driver as Mary Jane Presley.

While conducting a pat down search of Presley, the officer reportedly felt a plastic baggie inside her bra. When asked what was in her bra, Ms. Presley allegedly tried to reach into her bra and remove the items.

According to Officer Farmer's report, Ms. Presley was advised to stop resisting and place her hands behind her back, but she refused and continued to fight. At that time, Officer Farmer took Ms. Presley to the ground and placed her under arrest.

Reportedly found in Presley's bra were five 5 mg. Hydrocodone, one half 7.5 mg. Hydrocodone, two 40 mg. Oxycodone, one .25 mg. Alprazolam and a half of a round orange pill identified as Flexorel, a muscle relaxer.

An inventory of her car reportedly revealed a plastic baggie in her cigarette pack and a blue paper towel, both containing a green leafy substance be-

lieved to be Marijuana. Also located in her vehicle was a roach containing a green leafy substance believed to be Marijuana.

Patrolwoman Farmer, assisted by Patrolmen Jon Yates, LPD, and Patrolman Brendan DeBoer, LPD made the arrest.

Ard stated there was approximately 42 pills left in the bottle, which is a controlled medication.

Ms. Ard advised, she locked her vehicle prior to entering the apartment and found her vehicle was still locked when she went to get her medicine that evening. She stated her keys were in her purse and only one other person had the opportunity to get access to her purse while she was at this location and that person also was the only one that knew she left her medication in her vehicle. The case is under investigation.

the Tennessee Division of Consumer Affairs. "However, these scams can be prevented if consumers know how to recognize them."

If you receive a sales call, ask yourself these questions:

* Who's calling and why? Telemarketers must tell you it's a sales call, the name of the seller and what they are selling before making a sales pitch.

* What is their hurry? Fast talkers who use high-pressure tactics could be hiding something. Take your time. Most legitimate businesses will give you time and written information about an offer before asking you to commit to a purchase.

* If it's free, why

are they asking me to pay? Question charges that sellers say you need to pay to redeem a prize or gift. Free is free. If you have to pay, it's a purchase – not a prize or gift. Telemarketers must tell you that no purchase or payment is necessary to enter or win.

* Why am I "confirming" my account information? Some callers have your billing information before they call you. They are trying to get you to confirm your account information so they can claim you approved a charge. Never give credit card, checking account or Social Security numbers to unknown callers.

If your phone numbers are on the National Do Not Call Registry, you should

get calls only from companies with whom you do business or those that have your permission to call. To report violations, visit www.donotcall.gov or call 1-888-382-1222. If

you are the victim of a telemarketing scam, report it. You can file a complaint online with Consumer Affairs at www.tn.gov/consumer or request a complaint form by calling 1-800-342-8385.

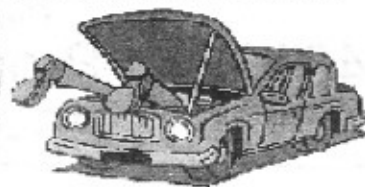

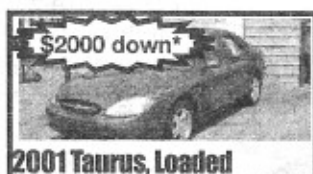
