Henry

Thursday, at approximately 5:40 p.m., James Henry was involved in a two vehicle accident with injury when he crossed the center line into oncoming traffic on Highway 411 and struck a vehicle head on at an angle.

According to Trooper Eric Miller, THP Henry was very confused and refused medical attention. then decided to sign a medical waiver for medical attention given to him by EMS. Mr. Henry could not perform field sobriety tasks as instructed and was very unsteady on his feet.

Henry was placed under arrest and transported to Fort Loudoun Medical Center for treatment and a BAC, then to the Loudon County Jail where he allegedly admitted to taking several prescription medications prior to driving.

Records indicate Henry caused serious bodily injury to the other party involved in the crash and the other vehicle rolled

of 10.7 percent. The June rate a year ago was 6.4 percent. The national unemployment rate for June 2009 was 9.5 percent, up from the May rate of 9.4 percent.

"Like the national unemployment rate, Tennessee's unemployment rate has continued to climb," reported Labor Commissioner James Neeley. "The fact that this is such a minor increase is encouraging as the state had experienced steeper increases in unemployment rates each month for several consecutive months."

The last time Tennessee's unemployment rate (seasonally adjusted) was as high as the current rate was November

cial assistance; and 300 in other services. Major employment decreases occurred in local government educational services, down by 24,500; state government educational services declined by 4,200 jobs; and manufacturing decreased by 3,900.

Major Changes in Estimated Nonagricultural Employment June 2008 to June 2009

Year-over-year increases occurred in local government, up by *12,900; health care and social assistance increased 10,100; and arts, entertainment and recreation gained 1,600; manufacturing was down 51,000; trade transportation and

utilities lost 29,100; and mining and construction decreased by 26,600.

*Local government increases were primarily caused by the inclusion of approximately 9,400 Summer Youth Program workers (American Recovery and Reinvestment Act).

and investigated the incident, finding that Mr. Myers had gotten into an argument with his juvenile son over sandwich meat. Upon further investigation, it was learned Mr. Myers and his son got into a physical altercation. Mr. Myers then went into a back room and retrieved a shotaun. One of the sons fled the residence and Mr. Myers came out on the porch and fired one round from a 12 gauge shotgun, stated Sheriff Guider.

The investigation by deputies and CID revealed that Mr. Myers had been convicted of having a meth lab in 2008. The sheriff advised Mr. Myers was still on parole at the time of the incident. Later in the investigation ATF agents and Loudon County CID executed a search warrant at Mr. Myers's residence. Evidence was taken and process by ATF.

Sheriff Guider advised that on July 13, 2009 ATF and Loudon County investigators arrested Mr. Myers on the indictment without incident. The sheriff advised his office will continue to work with the U.S. Attorney's Office with cases that meet federal prosecution guidelines.

Moses, of Cleveland. The four winners were announced during the June meeting of the Tennessee Wildlife Resources Commission.

All proceeds from the sale of the remaining special bull elk tag will go exclusively to the elk restoration program. The TWRF is partnering with the Rocky Mountain Elk Foundation (RMEF), Safari Club International (SCI), and the Tennessee Wildlife Federation (TWF), on the promotion of the last elk tag.

The five hunters will be invited to attend an elk camp complete with wall tents, campfires, meals, and entertainment. The elk camp will be held at the property of Terry Lewis near the NorthCumberlandW-MAElkViewingTower. Sponsors for the event include TWRF, TWRA, TWF, RMEF, and Campbell Outdoor Recreation Association (CORA).

TWRF is a non-profit organization dedicated to promoting habitat conservation, an ethic of land stewardship, and Tennessee's hunting and fishing heritage for the benefit of TWRA and Tennessee's outdoor enthusiasts.
