



eight counties and remained the same in three counties.

Lincoln County registered the state's lowest county unemployment rate at 7.1 percent, up from 6.5 percent in May. Perry County had the state's highest unemployment rate at 22.1 percent, down from 24.2 in May, followed

by Lauderdale County at 19.7 percent, up from 19.2 percent in May.

Knox County had the state's lowest major metropolitan rate of 8.5 percent, up 0.6 percentage point from the May rate. Davidson County was 9.4 percent, up 0.8 from the previous month. Hamilton County was at 9.3 percent, up 0.6 percentage point from the May rate, and Shelby County was 10.5 percent, up from the May rate of 9.5 percent.


