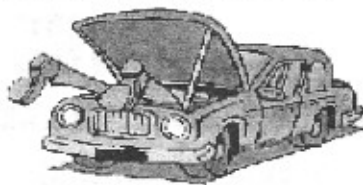

Project

When completed, the \$38.7 million project will widen the existing highway from four lanes to six lanes including shoulders, curb and gutter and sidewalks, from Boyds Creek Highway (SR-338) to SR-448 in Sevierville. Highway 66, also known as the Great Smoky Mountains Parkway, is the main artery into the popular tourist destinations of Sevierville, Pigeon Forge, Gatlinburg and the Great Smoky Mountains National Park. With over 9 million visitors last year, the Great Smoky Mountains National Park is the most visited national park in the country.

"Highway 66 is a very busy route especially during peak travel seasons as vacationers make their way into Sevier County," said TDOT Chief Engineer Paul Degges. "The improvements we are making with these Recovery Act funds will help reduce congestion and improve safety on Highway 66."

Debra Anne Harmon, 51, West Gallahar Ferry Road, Knoxville, was charged with DUI by consent

and public intoxication.

According to reports, Monday, at approximately 9:09 p.m., Officer Samuel Harrison, LPD observed a

Toyota Camry traveling west on Highway 72 at Interstate 75 with no headlights on. The officer stopped the vehicle on Highway 72 just past the entrance to the Citgo Gas Station and according to Officer Harrison's report, he immediately detected a strong odor of an alcoholic beverage coming from within the passenger compartment of the car.

The driver, identified as Charles L. Shepherd, had a very strong odor of an alcoholic beverage about his person and breath, very slurred speech, bloodshot eyes and was unsteady on his feet.

Shepherd reportedly admitted to drinking alcohol that evening and there were open containers of alcohol inside the vehicle.

Shepherd, who also seemed disori-

ented at times, performed very poorly on consented sobriety checks administered by the lawman. It was also discovered through the 911 Center Shepherd's license is currently revoked in the state of Tennessee for prior DUI offenses.

Approximately 3 grams of a green leafy substance believed to be Marijuana was discovered, laying in plain view, in the front passenger side door pocket.

Shepherd allegedly claimed ownership of the Marijuana. He was read the implied consent law and consented to a blood test.

According to reports, Harmon was charged after it was discovered she is the girlfriend of Charles Shepherd and was a passenger in the vehicle with him that evening. She is also

the registered owner of the Toyota Camry.

Harmon reportedly admitted to drinking 3 to 4 beers. She had a strong odor of an alcoholic beverage about her person and breath, slurred speech, bloodshot eyes and was unsteady on her feet.

Ms. Harmon allegedly admitted to the officer, she knew Shepherd had been drinking and was possibly impaired when she allowed him to drive.

Officer Samuel Harrison, LPD, made the arrests, along with Officer Marty Ward, LPD.

session of schedule III Hydrocodone.

According to the report, on Tuesday, July 28, 2009, at approximately 4:37 p.m., Sgt. Billy Hall, LCSO observed a red Ford F-250 traveling south on Interstate 75 in Loudon County at a speed well above the posted speed limit. He followed the vehicle approximately one mile at speeds between 68 and 72 mph in a 50 mph construction zone.

The officer stopped the vehicle on Interstate 75 south at the 73 mm. The driver was identified as Lisa K. Arrowood.

While Sgt. Hall was checking Arrowood's license and vehicle registration, Deputy Marty Stanley, LCSO arrived on the scene.

According to the report, while Deputy Stanley was issuing Arrowood a warning citation for speeding, Sgt. Hall deployed K9 Draga around Arrowood's truck.

K9 Draga alerted in the area of the driver's lower door seam. Hall deployed K9 Draga inside of the vehicle and she alerted in the area under the driver's seat.

A search of that area produced an eye glass case with a glass pipe used to smoke Meth and approximately 1 gram of a substance that later field tested positive as Meth.

Also found in the truck was a one pound bag of organic iodine commonly used to manufacture Meth.

Ms. Arrowood reportedly admitted to pur-

chasing the substance for someone to manufacture Meth with.

A check of Arrowood's name in the Meth Data Base showed that Arrowood had been purchasing large amounts of Pseudo Ephedrine.

On July 3rd, 2009, she purchased Pseudo Ephedrine at Wal Mart in Lenoir City.

Arrowood allegedly admitted that the Pseudo Ephedrine was purchased to manufacture Meth with.

Also found in the truck during the search was several pieces of a yellow pill believed to be Hydrocodone 10 mg, a schedule III drug.

Sgt. Hall and Deputy Stanley, LCSO made the arrest.

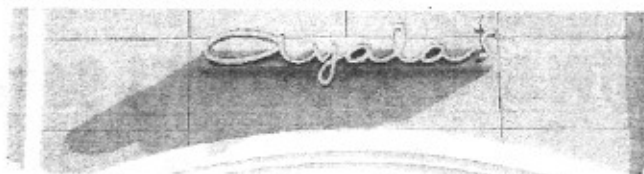
