NASHVILLE --- A portion of the Emory River near the Tennessee Valley Authority's Kingston Steam Plant will be closed as cleanup efforts continue from the massive release of coal ash from the steam plant on Dec. 22, 2008.

The Tennessee Wildlife Resources Agency (TWRA) has received notification that the Environmental Protection Agency has made an announcement to close

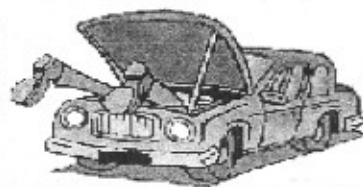

speeding through the parking lot. The Stratus attempted to exit the parking lot onto Hwy 72. The Tracer pulled in front of the Stratus trying to come into contact with the vehicle to keep it from entering the highway. The stratus turned into the car wash that was adjoining Food City.

After getting the vehicles stopped the driver was identified as Olivia Marie Richardson. Ms. Richardson advised her husband was in the Stratus and she was attempting to stop him from leaving. The victim also had their 3-month-old child in the vehicle.

After speaking with both subjects the officer found out it was a domestic situation from Monroe County that had escalated and became a dangerous situation. Ms. Richardson became very uncooperative and was taken into custody.

According to witness and the victims statements Christopher Lee Turner did attempt to engage in a physical altercation in the parking lot of Food City. Mr. Turner was in the company of his sister, Olivia Richardson. Both followed Richardson's husband to the Food City parking lot.

When the vehicle the victim was riding in stopped Mr. Turner exited the vehicle cussing and hitting his fist. Mr. Turner ran toward the vehicle making threatening statements.

The driver pulled away and was followed by Olivia Richardson and Mr. Turner ran after the vehicle. The vehicle that Ms. Richardson was chasing was occupied by the victim, his father and her 3-month-old child.

The victim stated he was in fear for his life and pulled off when he saw Mr. Turner.

Turner's actions and his following the victims to Loudon County from Monroe County helped police determine to be the primary aggressor. Turner was advised by Monroe County earlier in the night to go home and stay away from the victims and Richardson was given at least two breaks by officers after MCSO was called on her. Sgt. RS Newman, LPD made the arrests.

Christopher Lee Turner, 21, of Ridge Crest Drive, Madisonville, was charged with domestic violence assault as was his sister Olivia Marie Richardson, 20, of Bluebird Lane, Sweetwater.

River

TWRA has been involved in response activities including assessment of the initial impact to wildlife resources, public safety and boating, and initiating sampling to track long-term effect on wildlife and habitat since the spill. The Kingston Steam Plant is located on a peninsula where the Emory River joins the Clinch River on Watts Bar Reservoir. The area is popular for fishing, boating and wildlife viewing.

Following the spill, TWRA issued a notice that fishing and boating should be avoided in the lower section of the Emory River, and that existing advisories for Watts Bar should be followed.
