According to records, Corporal Chad Estes, LCSO was dispatched to North Trigonia Road in Greenback to an aggravated assault by domestic violence. Upon arrival, the victim advised his aunt, Linda Gregory came to his residence and pulled a gun in an attempt to shoot him.

The incident reportedly occurred after the pair had a telephone conversation in which Gregory thought her nephew called her an obscene name and she then threatened to go to his residence and kill him.

Corporal Estes then went to Gregory's home, also on North

Trigonia Road, where he found she had a strong odor of an alcoholic beverage about her person.

Ms. Gregory told the officer her nephew called her a name while talking to her on the phone and when they hung up, she got a .25 auto Raven pistol and went to the residence to confront her nephew.

Gregory reportedly also stated she pulled the weapon from her rear pants pocket and a physical fight occurred between her and her nephew before he took the weapon away from her and she went back to her house.

The officer noted Linda Gregory did go to her nephew's residence with the intention of a confrontation and took a weapon with her to cause death or bodily harm to him.

Gregory was arrested and taken to the Loudon County Jail.
