Records indicate a short time after arriving at the jail Monday, Jones was visited by Patrolman

Jason Felts, LCPD who charged him with the second count of theft under \$500 in connection with an incident which occurred just across the street from Bimbo's three days later on August 30.

According to Officer Felts. Jones went to Interstate Shell and grabbed a pack of Camel cigarettes from behind the counter then ran out the door without paying.

An assistant manager identified Jones from a lineup and told the lawman he ran out after him and as he was trying to get the tag number off the truck Mr. Jones put the truck in reverse and almost ran over him. Another man was at the store and witnessed the incident. He chased the truck and got the tag number.

Jones was later charged with aggravated assault because he nearly ran over the assistant manager while fleeing and turned himself in to Deputy Michael Wilson at the Loudon County Jail Wednesday to face that charge.

purchased plus a \$2 internet usage fee. (The \$2 internet fee is collected by the company that maintains the internet site and is not a fee charged by the TWRA).

The receipt is the hunter's permit. He/ she must have this receipt with him/her while hunting.
