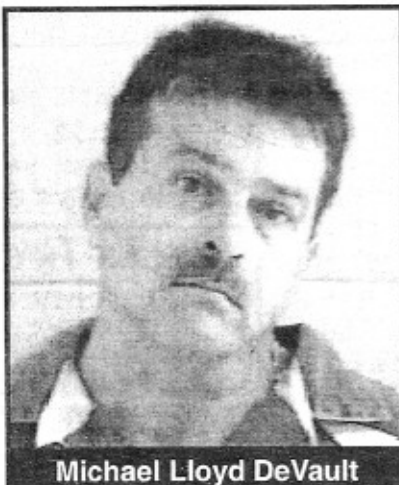

sion of controlled substance in penal facility schedule III, possession of controlled substance in penal facility schedule II and possession of drug paraphernalia.

The report states, at approximately 2:42am, while observing the cameras for 'F' block, a few inmates were seen together heading for the shower area of the block. Deputies Wright and Rolen, LCSO entered 'F'

block and found Michael DeVault and another inmate inside the shower. Deputies pulled the two men out of the block and escorted them to the back booking area.

Deputy Wright asked the pair if they had any type of contraband on them before he searched them and Mr. DeVault reportedly handed Deputy Wright a lighter that was retrieved from his sock.

After performing a search of DeVault, the deputy found a body of an ink pen that had

been cut in half which is commonly used to snort drugs.

Corporal Angi Martin, LCSO asked Mr. DeVault to explain the paraphernalia that was found on his person and he stated he just found the 1/2 pen on the ground in the block and decided to hold onto it just in case he could talk someone out of their night time medication.

DeVault reportedly advised "I like to snort medications, that's what I do".

After securing Mr. DeVault into a holding cell, Corporal Martin and Deputy Wright retrieved his property from 'F' block.

The pills were found wrapped in a piece of gray plastic inside a pair of socks.

Deputy Wright also found a pill, white in color believed to be oxycontin 20 mg Schedule II wrapped in a wad of paper.

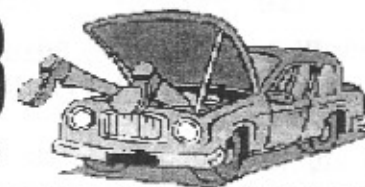

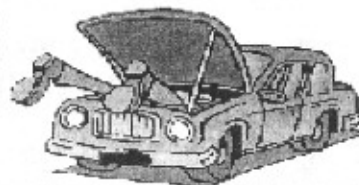

launching its first-ever big game internet check-in system this year.

With the new system, TWRA is trying to accommodate hunters who may have difficulty finding an open check station by now allowing those hunters to check their harvested animals in over the internet. The new system can be accessed by visiting TWRA's main Web site at www.tnwildlife.org or by going directly to the check-in page at www.twra-checkin.com.

"The system is open to everybody who harvests a big game

animal," said Daryl Ratajczak, TWRA Big Game Coordinator. "Although we do want our hunters to utilize our check stations, we understand it's not always a viable option, especially on those late-night retrievals. We also understand that taking a deer to a check station is a tradition for many of our hunters, and with almost 900 check stations statewide, it is a tradition that hopefully will remain strong."

In the instance that a hunter must use the internet check-in system, he/she should find it user-friendly.

"The new system is really easy to use but it does require

that you print out your permanent kill-tag and your next temporary kill-tag," said Ratajczak. "If for some reason you are unable to print your tags immedi-

ately there will be an option for hunters to print a temporary kill-tag from the hunting page on our main Web site."

Hunters must remember that it is ille-

gal to hunt the following day until all the animals harvested the previous day have been checked-in.

Deer archery season opens across the state on Sept. 26.

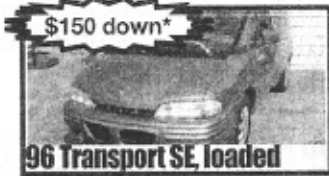

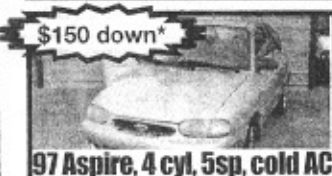

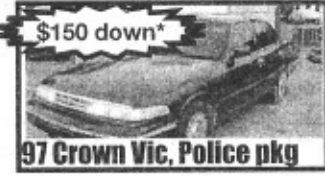

Statement from TDOS Commissioner Dave Mitchell on Order by Judge Thomas Stovall

NASHVILLE --- On Monday, September 21, 2009, Chief Administrative Judge Thomas G. Stovall upheld the termination of former THP Lieutenant Ronnie Shirley.

Statement from Commissioner Dave Mitchell:

"The evidence was overwhelming that Ronnie Shirley engaged in gross misconduct, that he was untruthful and that his highly publicized actions ruined his credibility. Shirley's conduct and actions were unacceptable for a Tennessee State Trooper. Unauthorized access of sensitive law enforcement databases is clearly inappropriate and violates the portal user agree-

ment not to mention the privacy of Tennesseans."

Additional Information:

Since the internal THP investigation of Ronnie Shirley into unauthorized access of the Integrated Criminal Justice Web Portal (ICJWP), additional safeguards have been instituted to prevent such abuse. The department now conducts regular reviews of AOC audits on portal usage to catch any irregularities. Internal communication to employees has repeatedly emphasized that computer queries to satisfy curiosity are not appropriate and constitute a clear violation of the user agreement and Gen-

eral Orders. With these safeguards, law enforcement will continue to use the portal and other data for legitimate police purposes to carry out the mission of public safety.
