





these charges were many that included the Sale of Schedule II, Methamphetamine in a School Zone and Sale of Schedule II, Oxycodone a Protected Zone, both of which carry mandatory 100% to serve sentences, as well as cases for Prescription Fraud.

On Thursday, January 5, the 9th District Drug Task Force orchestrated a drug roundup of 57 Defendants on the Loudon County New Bills. Several agencies assisted: Loudon County Sheriff's Office, Lenoir City Police Department, Loudon Police Department, 5th District Drug Task Force, 7th District Drug Task Force, Tennessee Highway Patrol, State of TN Probation and Parole, Tennessee Bureau of Investigation, Tennessee

Dangerous Drugs Task Force, Homeland Security, the US Marshal's Service and the US Drug Enforcement Agency along with a helicopter provided and operated by the National Guard Counter Drug. The collaborative effort led to 37 people being arrested and nine others, who already in custody, were served with their criminal court capiases. Many defendants were located in Loudon County, while others were found in various surrounding counties of Monroe, McMinn, Anderson, Roane and Knox. In some instances additional drugs and paraphernalia were found.

Friday morning 34 of those arrested were arraigned at the Loudon County Courthouse. During this process legal counsel was appointed and they have been set for status dates this January/February

Sentencing has been set for May 17, 2017, at 11:00 a.m., in U.S. District Court in Knoxville, Tennessee. Ho faces a maximum sentence of 10 years in prison and a maximum \$250,000 fine. The maximum statutory sentence is prescribed by Congress and is provided here for informational purposes, as the sentencing of the defendant will be determined by the court based on the advisory Sentencing Guidelines and other statutory factors.
