March 2014, an investigator with Knoxville Internet Crimes Against Children Task Force (ICAC) downloaded a child pornography video from Conard's computer over the internet, though the file sharing network set up by Conard. Federal investigators executed a warrant at Conard's residence in May 2016 and seized his computer. A subsequent forensic examination of the computer revealed 91 images and 164 videos of child pornography, some of which contained known child victims.

This case was investigated by the Knoxville ICAC. Assistant U.S. Attorney Frank Dale represented the United States.

This case was brought as part of Project Safe Childhood, a nationwide initiative to combat the growing epidemic of child sexual exploitation and abuse launched in May 2006 by the Department of Justice. Led by U.S. Attorneys' Offices and the Criminal Division's Child Exploitation and Obscenity Section, Project Safe Childhood marshals federal, state and local resources to better locate, apprehend and prosecute individuals who exploit children via the Internet, as well as to identify and rescue victims. 



One of his own family members alerted the authorities saying had physically seen Bradly take the pitbull mix, named 'Baby Girl,' to his room and engage in sexual contact with her. She estimates it's been happening more than 100 times in the past years.

The family member also says she witnessed the attack because Bradly's bedroom door has a hole in it as a result of a previous violent outburst.
