Counties were able to recover or write-\$2,450,533.97 off through restitution payments, insurance claims or other means. That left a net unrecovered shortage of \$841,464.01 at the end

The Comptroller's office also released its report detailing cash shortages and other thefts for Tennessee municipalities, internal school funds, utility districts, housing authorities, nonprofits, and other governmental entities. These shortages were reported in fiscal year 2015 and earlier.

Fiscal year 2015 began with a cash shortage of \$2,713,071.
