volved and other drivers. While in this ring, the conspirators generally did not involve other motorists, criminals sometimes do stage accidents involving unsuspecting drivers.

"You never know who's going to come around the corner. You could hit an innocent person. It's really a public safety issue," Gasiorek said, noting that even willing participants in the staged accidents are unexpectedly injured.

"When insurance companies pay fraudulent claims, everyone's premiums go up," Curtin said. "More importantly, the staged crashes pose risks to first responders. You had police officers and EMTs rushing to crash scenes. The wasted time of medical pro-







fessionals was also a concern with ER doctors and nurses treating these fraudsters for non-existent injuries. It took time away from other patients who really needed medical attention."

At least in the local region, Curtin said word has gotten out that law enforcement is working these cases and bringing perpetrators to justice.

"The insurance companies have said that suspicious claims, especially those involving single-car accidents on remote roads, are down in southeastern Connecticut," Curtin said. "They're not seeing these types of suspicious accidents because this case has sent a message."

Could Your Fender Been er Bender Have Been Staged? Tips from the NICB

Staged accident fraudsters sometimes targeted innocent drivers in their dangerous schemes. If you think your car accident has been staged, the NICB suggests:

If you are not injured and can safely do so, take pictures of the accident scene.

Observe the details of what happened, such as how many people were in the other car. Fraudsters will often lie about how many people were in the vehicle.

If you suspect car insurance fraud, visit the NICB's Speak Up page to file a report.

New Audit Shows Willingness to Proactively Address Problems

The Tennessee Comptroller's Office has released a performance audit on the Tennessee Rehabilitative Initiative in Correction Board (TRICOR) showing the agency has taken steps to improve its management and shown its willingness to proactively address problems.

TRICOR provides occupational and life skills training for Tennessee's incarcerated population through job training.

A 2015 performance audit raised serious concerns about TRICOR's financial operations and its handling of Tennessee's Cook Chill program. Performance auditors are now reporting that TRICOR has corrected three of the five findings noted in the 2015 audit, and has partially corrected the other two.

Since the 2015 audit, TRICOR promoted its Chief Operating Officer to Chief Executive Officer and named a new chair of the board of directors. TRICOR's CEO is also holding bi-weekly meetings with the chair of the board, and the Internal Auditor

"While TRICOR has not completely solved all of the issues noted in the prior audit, I am pleased with the progress made," said Comptroller Justin P. Wilson. "Many of the necessary changes will take considerable time, but I am encouraged."

also released TRICOR's first financial statement audit. Due to numerous deficiencies, the auditors were unable to obtain sufficient evidence to form an opinion on TRICOR's financial statements.


The two new reports contain six audit findings and one observation. TRICOR management has indicated it is in the process of correcting all of the identified issues.


