Heather Brooks also manipulated or withheld the PTO's financial reports to conceal this activity from the board.

The Brooks' admitted to investigators that they misused PTO funds and assisted Comptroller investigators with identifying their personal transactions. After the discovery of these discrepancies, PTO operations were suspended. The organization was administratively dissolved in March 2017.

Matthew and Heather Brooks were each indicted by the Campbell County Grand Jury on one count of





Pierce, Kristopher 23, Steekee Road Loudon, was charged with Domestic Assault.


