coordination with local, state, federal, and internationpartners—both law enforcement and non-governmental organizations—the FBI devotes extensive refighting the sexual exploitation of children. And while the high number of arrests and speaks convictions to law enforcement's successes, there is still much work to be done. According to a 2016 Department of Justice report to Congress, "The expansion of the Internet has led to an explosion in the market for child pornography."

"After you've been doing this awhile, you think you've seen it all, and then you get a new case," said Special Agent Eric Campbell, who investigates violent crimes against children in the FBI's Phoenix Division. "I am surprised by how often I am surprised at what people will do."

Campbell points to one of his recent cases as an example. In February 2017, a 28-yearold Arizona woman was sentenced to more than five years in prison for mailing child pornography to her imprisoned husband. He was behind bars in

Tucson awaiting trial on separate child pornography charges—for which he would eventually receive a 20year sentence.

Some of the images the woman mailed her husband were of girls as young as 9 years





According to eyewitnesses who testified at his trial, Goldston displayed the sawedoff shotgun during a heated exchange with an unarmed man as children stood by and watched. The altercation took place in the middle of the day in a residential neighborhood in Cleveland.

U.S. Attorney Nancy Stallard Harr said, "Goldston's sentence reflects the danger and risk of harm his conduct posed to society. The Sixth Circuit Court of Appeals pre-


