Awards were launched in 1990 as a way to individuals spotlight and organizations for their work in combating crime, drugs, terrorism, and violence. Today's recipients were also recognized for their work in bridging the relationships between law enforcement agencies and the communities they serve, developing strategies to battle the nation's opioid crisis, and assisting victims of human trafficking, among other efforts.

Honorees are nominated by each of the FBI's 56 field offices, as well as the Bureau's Office of Public Affairs and the Criminal Justice Information Services Division.

In his remarks, Director Comey said this year's recipients embodied the words attributed to the 16th century minister John Wesley, who said, "Do all the good you can. By all the means you can. In all the ways you can. In all the places you can. At all the times you can. To all the people you can. As long as ever you can."

The Director related a story about speaking to young audiences and warning them against losing sight of what really matters in life. He would ask them to close their eyes, imagine they were old, and then ask


